Dear Brother Knights,

Every Marian month, I am grateful to the Knights of Columbus for leading the rosary before each Mass. Not only is this practice important as a form of prayer and petition for the wellbeing of our families; it also is a form of catechesis. In recent years, as fewer and fewer families pray the rosary together, young people often have no idea how to pray the rosary.

Easter presents another opportunity for the Knights of Columbus to lead prayer and provide catechesis in the parish. Pope Saint John Paul II designated the second Sunday of Easter each year to be Divine Mercy Sunday. Initially, I was not enthusiastic about the devotion to Divine Mercy. It seemed to be so similar to devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as to be unnecessary. As a pastor, I knew I had to "make the best of it" so to speak. As I have done so, I have grown to see its importance in the life of the Church. St. Faustina had a keen sense of the problem of sin and a resulting desire for God's mercy. Today we lament a loss of a sense of sin in our society. Part of the cause is our loss of reverence for God's holiness. The devotion to Divine Mercy stresses both God's holiness and His mercy. As I noted in the bulletin, if you want to begin a novena for Divine Mercy, start saying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy on Good Friday. The chaplet proceeds more rapidly than a ro-

sary, and you can find it on many Catholic websites and smart-phone apps. While I don't say the chaplet often, I do often use the prayers of the chaplet in repetitive prayer when walking or trying to go to sleep. We pray, "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion have mercy on us and on the whole world." The prayer sums up our mission of prayer and charity - to bring God's mercy to the whole world.



The Mississippi Pro-Life Banquet is on Thursday, April 5th at First Baptist Jackson. The keynote speaker is Lt. Col. Allen B. West. The VIP Meet-n-Greet will begin at 5:00 p.m. and end at 6:00 p.m. The banquet will start at 6:30. Currently attending are Bob and Rosalie Leo, Larry Birzer, Frank Sharp and myself.

The Walk for Life campaign will be held on April 28th. We will drive to Jackson and walk from St. Richards Catholic Church to the Women's Health Organization for song and prayers. **Volunteers are needed** as this is another fundraising event. By the time you read this our 40 Days for Life Spring campaign will be completed. At the time

I am writing this, the latest update on babies saved from abortion during this 40 Days for Life campaign was on March 26th. So far we've learned of 490 babies in 354 locations around the world whose mothers have rejected abortion and chosen life! Thank you for helping save so many lives!

On Monday, March 19th, Mississippi Gov. Phil Bryant signed a bill to protect unborn babies and moms from abortion after 15 weeks of pregnancy. Bryant hopes to make Mississippi "the safest place in America" for unborn babies by supporting a bill to ban abortions after 15 weeks. State House Bill 1510, signed into law, created the earliest ban on abortion in any state in the U.S. by pushing back Mississippi's current limit by 5 weeks. This bill prohibits abortions after 15 weeks. Previous Mississippi law banned abortion at 20 weeks after conception, similar to limits in 17 other states.

Unfortunately, U.S. District Judge Carlton Reeves on Tuesday granted a temporary restraining order requested by the state's only abortion clinic. Pray that the court will lift this restraining order. Pray that our state leaders will have courage to stand up and pass a law making it illegal to have an abortion at any stage in life.

Consider these trials in light of God's plan for you. The Apostle Paul understood the big picture when he said in Romans 8:18, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us." This is our Hope and our victory. Let us rejoice in the opportunity to give that Hope to others in our path.
