BISHOP COYNE REQUEST:

Our Bishop has made a request to "FEED THE HUNGRY" and there are some Councils who have already done a food drive. We are asking ALL Councils to assist our Bishop with this request, even if it is done via a drive-through with people dropping off non-perishable food items. This comes in line with Supreme's 'Leave No Neighbor Behind'. At your next Council officers' meeting, please bring up this issue as a project for your Council to engage in. Thank you.

ULTRASOUND VAN UPDATE

As stated in the past few newsletters, we as members in the jurisdiction of Vermont have succeeded in securing enough funds to purchase the van, however the cost of converting the van is much higher than we anticipated. We still could use help financially to ensure that this becomes a reality sooner than later. Aspire Together is in the process of fund raising and they are going to need roughly \$202,000 less our donation of \$50,000. So again, if you would like to help by donating, please do. - 1. COUNCIL #5041 RAISES FUNDS FOR FOODSHELVES

While brainstorming at a business meeting for a Lenten project, a typical food collection for area food shelves entered the discussion. Upon conversations with food shelf personnel, it was learned that food is available however there is a need for things like personal care items, diapers and the like. We felt rather than trying to figure out what they might need, we would raise funds for them to purchase needed items. Father Boivin Council #5041 would participate by matching the first \$1000 raised.

A special collection basket was made up to put on the offertory table at Most Holy Name of Jesus Parish and K of C envelopes were made available for those wishing to use them and pleas were made in announcements at Masses. Knowing that some people are not attending Mass at the moment, we asked the office staff if they would include an announcement in the church bulletin which is also emailed to parishioners. Also the announcement was sent on the parish email list and our own council email list giving an address to which donations could be sent.

The first weekend \$1117 was taken in, already surpassing our goal. Knowing that more donations would be coming, we approached the MHNJP Social Action Ministry (SAM) and they eagerly agreed to match our \$1000 of matching funds. Over the next 3 weekends another \$1938 was donated by parishioners raising the total collected to \$3055 plus our \$1000 match and SAM's \$1000 match for a grand total of \$5055 to be shared by the Johnson Food Shelf and Lamoille Food Share in Morrisville.

In April we will be holding a takeout steak supper, the proceeds of which will be added to this project.

The Father Boivin Council 5041 in Morrisville is preparing a "Benefit Steak Supper" on Saturday, April 17th at the Crosby Center behind Holy Cross Church in Morrisville. The menu includes Santa Maria Steak, Baked Potato, Mixed Vegetable & Roll. Cost is \$12.00. The take-out meal will be available for pick-up from 5-6:30 PM. Refund Support Vocations Program

(RSVP)

The future of our church in Vermont is directly tied to people answering God's call to a religious vocation. Promoting vocations to the priesthood and religious life are high priorities of the Knights of Columbus. As Knights, we pledge assistance to the Church by financial and moral aid through our Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP). We should plan programs to promote vocations awareness to young people as well as council members and their families.

Councils are required to provide financial support of at least \$500 for a minimum of one seminarian. Councils are also required to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success.

The intent of RSVP is to demonstrate support for individual seminarians. RSVP support is not solely financial aid, and councils are asked not to base their support on the financial needs of the seminarian. All seminarians are worthy of support through RSVP by virtue of the fact that they are discerning a religious vocation, not because of their financial situation.

Please remember that with RSVP, Knights provide more than financial support; members write letters to the seminarians or postulants, sponsor dinners for them, invite them to join the council and, most importantly, pray for vocations.

ACTION ALERT: HR 5

The So-Called Equality Act

National Right to Life opposed passage of H.R. 5, which passed the House, 224-206, on February 25, 2021 (House Roll Call No. 39). The bill was supported by 221 Democrats and 3 Republicans. It was opposed by 206 Republicans. 2 Republicans did not vote. In addition to other issues, H.R. 5 poses a significant pro-life threat. It amends the 1964 Civil Rights Act, adding language that could be used to make abortions more available, expand taxpayer funding of abortion, and weaken conscience protections for health care providers opposed to participating in abortions.

Timing on a Senate vote is unclear, but could happen on short notice. NRLC's scorecard advisory can be found here:

CALL TO ACTION:

Contact your U.S. Senators with letters, emails, and calls urging them to vote "No" on this bill.

The U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee held a hearing on HR 5 on March 17, 2021. Leaders in the Senate have declared their intent to move this bill to a full Senate vote quickly. It is imperative that PRO-LIFERS take immediate strategic action to stop its passage.
