## A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN, REVEREND MARTIN VALLELY



Dear Brothers,

In this blessed month of April, we shall celebrate again the centerpiece of our faith, the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord. May your

Lenten sacrifices and prayers lead you straight to the Cross of your Saviour. And let us not forget to pray for our dear brother Stan Semeniuk, genuine and generous, who certainly bore the cross of his own suffering with tremendous faith and confidence in the Lord whom he now beholds, face to face.

Just as I did at Christmas with the Infancy Narratives, so I want to look now at the Passion Narratives. Each of the four Gospels has its own account of the events of Holy Thursday and Good Friday, as well as its distinctive story of the events of Easter Sunday and the days following. In fact, those last few chapters of each Gospel are the starting point for understanding the entire Gospel in the first place. Each Evangelist knew that there would have been no point in writing the rest of his Gospel if it had not been for the climax of it, the proclamation of why the Son of God came into our midst, what this was all leading to.

While the principal outline of the events of Good Friday is essentially the same for each Gospel, there are subtle differences which highlight the most important emphases of each Gospel writer. I

remember first discovering and being curious about these differences as a child, when we would hear all four Passion Narratives every Holy Week: Matthew on Palm Sunday, Mark on the Tuesday of Holy Week, Luke on Wednesday, and John on Good Friday. Now we hear Matthew, Mark, and Luke in a three-year cycle on Palm Sunday, but we still have John on Good Friday every year.

A most interesting summation of those subtle distinctions is found in the words Jesus speaks. Matthew and Mark are relatively similar, with Jesus acknowledging before the Sanhedrin that he is indeed the Christ, then having little to say before Pontius Pilate, and thenceforth speaking only once, crying out on the Cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" As always, Matthew points out how everything which happens is by way of fulfilling the words spoken through the ancient prophets. As always, Mark notes the high cost of being a disciple of Jesus, drawing attention to how Jesus' followers for the most part deserted him and fled. That word of Jesus on the Cross, by the way, is a quotation from the beginning of Psalm 22. It is not so much a matter of Jesus himself declaring that he has been abandoned by God, rather he is in that moment identifying with all the suffering of the people for whom he is giving his life. That whole Psalm (not to be confused with Psalm 23, "The Lord is My Shepherd") is like an astonishing preview of the Passion and its effects. It is well worth a read in its entirety.

Luke's account is a bit more extended, featuring the visit to King Herod, and with more emphasis on the

relationship between Jesus and Peter, through Peter's denial to his repentance. It is also the only Passion Narrative in which Jesus speaks while carrying the Cross to Calvary, the scene we know as the Eighth Station of the Cross, when Jesus pauses to converse with the women of Jerusalem who are weeping over him, telling them they should rather weep for themselves and for their children. As he is being nailed to the Cross, Jesus murmurs, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they are doing." And from the Cross he offers the so-called Good Thief the promise, "This very day you shall be with me in paradise." Jesus' last words are, "Father, into your hands I commend (or 'commit') my Spirit." Luke's typical emphases on poverty, mercy and forgiveness, Spirit and Church, find their place even in Jesus' last words.

It is John's Narrative, as expected, that is the most remarkable for its emphases. Here one gets very little sense of Jesus as a submissive Victim-Lamb, and much more the sense that he is completely in charge of what happens to him. He speaks at length with both the chief priests and Pilate, controlling the conversation ("my kingdom is not of this world"); he carries his Cross unaided; and he makes astonishing statements (more like manifestos) from the Cross: "I thirst!" (for souls, that is); and "It is accomplished (or 'consummated')!" He declares that his mission has been accomplished, the reason for which he came to this earth. Also in there is the tender but extremely symbolic handing over of Mary and the Apostle John to one another ("Woman, behold your Son.....behold your Mother!"). Mary is given to the Church as our Mother. Even after his Death, the piercing of his side with a lance is important and symbolic, for the water and blood which flow out represent the testimony of God to the work of salvation, in Baptism and the Eucharist.

All the Gospels make sure that we know how it all ends: sealed up in the tomb, Jesus does not remain there, but gloriously rises on the first day of the week, to share with us the promise of eternal life and the command to spread the Good News to the end of time. How blessed are we to be witnesses to the great deeds God has done and is doing in our midst!

**GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE**

March was the month that we held our annual Shrove Tuesday pancakes and ham breakfast, lunch and dinner for charity, assisted by the Catholic Women's League; completed the annual Basketball Free Throw by presenting two trophies for participation to two local schools; commenced the stations of the cross on Fridays during lent, with the parish ministries taking a turn carrying the cross.

On Shrove Tuesday, we served a total of two hundred and twenty-four people. After expenses, the "free will offering" raised \$750 for charity. Donations of \$375 were given to the St. Vincent de Paul Society and Halton Women's Place.

On March 9, our Council hosted a "Faith in Action – Life Activities Meeting beginning with a continental breakfast. District Deputy Vic Lefebvre chaired the meeting, attended by ten Brother Knights, representing seven of the ten Halton Region Councils. The guest speaker was Ms. Elea Hofman, Executive Director of Halton Alive. Discussions tabled were the following: Halton Alive - Life Talks Conference, the possibility of three buses going to Ottawa on May 9th, from Burlington, Oakville and Milton, for the March for Life; the Halton Alive Walk for Life, scheduled on June 1st and the Supreme Ultrasound Program. It was proposed that we hold these meetings with all Councils in Halton Region four times a year; the next meeting possibly scheduled at the Marian Council in Oakville.

On March 10, at District Deputy Vic Lefebvre's request, our Council hosted a Formation Degree. Nine (9) Brothers from our Council were involved in the Degree, as well as Brothers from Fergus, Hamilton and Burlington Councils. Ten Members from Councils 5073 and 15920, including Brother Earl Kent Roy received the Honours of the Formation Degree. The Honouree of the Degree was in memory of Brother Hugh Johns. On March 24, Brother Andres Franco Aguilar received the Honours of the Formation Degree in Hamilton.



### Faith in Action


