Maryland March for Life

The Maryland March for Life was held Monday, March 14 in Annapolis. Hundreds of pro-lifers made the journey to Annapolis to proclaim "Support Pregnant Women; Hold Abortionists Accountable."

As always, many shared stories from around the country. Even in Maryland, according to Maryland Right to Life, "several abortion facilities have closed in the past year, a landmark court ruling declared a proabortion, anti-pregnancy center law unconstitutional, and prospects are optimistic for advancing pro-life legislation."

To further the efforts to restrict abortions, Cathy McLeod, Vice President of Maryland Right to Life, cited the need to pass bills like SB505 and HB23 which require abortion facilities to be held to the same safety standards as other ambulatory surgical centers throughout Maryland.

Please take time to urge your State Delegate and State Senator to support this legislation.





South Dakota passes strict regulations on Abortions

On March 22nd South Dakota became the first state in the country to require a woman seeking an abortion to visit a pregnancy help center first and submit to counseling to ensure her decision is "voluntary" and "informed."

Under the new law the woman must also wait at least 72 hours after completing the counseling before she can schedule an abortion, the longest waiting period in the nation. The law goes into effect on July 1.

Of course Planned Parenthood announced it will file a lawsuit seeking to repeal the law.

Let's pray that they fail and that more states will follow and regulate abortions out of existence.


