### "Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori"

Venerable Brothers, I want us to reflect this month on our fraternal motto: "**Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori**," "**Time Flies, Remember Death**." I think the founding father; Rev. Fr. Michael J. McGivney, who founded the Knight of Columbus in March 29, 1882, desires that the Knights of Columbus members may constantly reflect on the brevity of our earthly existence. Our Founder, Fr. Michael J. McGivney, who committed himself to the service of the immigrant men and women, died young of pneumonia at the age of 36. Although life is short, he who observes and discharges his duties faithfully will enjoy the promise of eternity in the Kingdom of God.

Time flies; remember death may sound frightening, but it is true. This is not being pessimistic; it is just being realistic. If you have any doubt, read Ecclesiastes 12:1. "Remember your Creator in the days of your youth, before the evil days come...." The author of Ecclesiastes summed up by focusing on the Creator and on the end of man's life. death, and what will happen when it comes, is described very forcefully here. Viewed from the perspective of death, man's life is a temporary gift given to him by God. One can glance back at one's youth and also at the years one may still have ahead and ponder the tenuous nature of life and remember that death is coming. Our lives are measured by time, whereby in the course of time, we change, grow old and, as with all living beings on earth, death becomes the normal end of life.

The Book of Psalms also admonishes us **not to forget how short our life is** by asking God to teach us to number our days so that we may get a heart of wisdom (Ps.90:12). In the opinion of the Psalmist, only God can provide the wisdom that a sensible man and woman can mark how short his or her life will be. It is when we are given true wisdom from above that will help us to discern the will of God. It is the wisdom of God that will help us to be faithful at all times to God, in order to avoid the laziness or idleness, which turns us away from being vigilant. As a matter of fact, the Psalmist turns to a complaint contrasting God's eternity with the brevity of human life and seeing in human suffering the punishment for sin by concluding with a plea for God's intervention saying: **teach us to number our days so that we may get a heart of wisdom**. Here God is not only implored to teach us how oppressive life is, but also to teach us how to accept our allotted time as a gift. Better still, human transience the reality of death as part of God's plan becomes not an occasion for despair but an opportunity for prayer for a successful end.

In order to have a successful end Jesus teaches us to "Seek first His Kingdom (of God) and His righteousness, and all these things will be given you as well" (Mat. 6:33). According to scholars, the righteousness of the Kingdom means the life of grace in man which involves a whole series of spiritual and moral values and can be summed up in the notion of "holiness." The search for holiness should be our primary purpose in life as Christians. Jesus is again insisting on the primacy of spiritual demands. Pope Paul VI opines that it is to give God, the kingdom of God, the first place in the scale of values which are the object of human aspirations. Jesus says: "Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness..." Christ's poverty makes possible that detachment from earthly things which allows us to place the relationship with God at the peak of human aspirations (General Audience, 5 January 1977).

In conclusion, venerable Brothers, let us not be afraid about our fraternal motto: "Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori," "Time Flies, Remember Death" or life is short; therefore, remember death. Jesus' advice to all of us is that "do not be afraid of those who can kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and the body in Gehenna [hell]" (Mat. 10:28). Jesus is telling us that hell exist; therefore, we should fear and respect God and prepare for eternity each and every day. It is only when we accept the reality and the brevity of our human existence that we can avoid all the avoidable mistakes and do our uppermost best to live a holy life. The final message of our Founder Fr. Michael J. McGivney to us is that; "yesterday I was like you in anyway and tomorrow you will be like me." May God give us grace to live a holy and faithful life, so that our soul will find rest in God. Amen!






