CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

Thoughts on the Eucharist

In 1946 I entered first grade at St. Victor's School in Monroe. My dad had to be to work at 7:30 a.m., so he would give me a ride to school each day and drop me off at the Church as our school day began with Mass each day. I was usually the first person in church and would sit down front where my grade sat. I grew to love that time alone with Jesus on the altar.

In second grade, I began serving Mass after learning the prayers in Latin first. And, that year twenty-five of us received Jesus for the first time on May 15, 1947. From that time on through six years at St. Lawrence Seminary and six years at St. Francis Major Seminary until ordination May 28, 1966, we received Holy Communion kneeling and on the tongue.

After ordination, I obviously received Communion standing. My classmates and I were the priests along with the Catholic Herald that introduced the New Liturgy to the people. The Mass would now be in the language of the people. The priest would say Mass facing the people and the people would have the option of receiving Holy Communion in the hand or kneeling and receiving on the tongue.

Having done it both ways for many years, it doesn't matter which way you prefer provided that you believe that you are receiving Jesus. Not just a symbol but actually Jesus, that you are in the state of sanctifying grace and have prepared yourself through your participation in the Mass. It is how you are disposed that is important.

Over the years there have been abuses both ways by people who have no concept of what they are doing when they come to Communion. In my experience in parishes, funerals were occasions for abuse. People would come up to receive Communion who never bothered to go to Mass or Confession, thus receiving in serious sin. Other abuses such as people passing the Eucharist from one to another in the pew, which I believe has been stopped.

In all the parishes I have helped out in since I retired, I have not run into disrespectful reception of Holy Communion.

The Eucharist is what drew me to the priesthood. Each day the greatest thing to do as a priest each day is to offer the Mass.

In the days to come, no matter which way the Eucharist is offered to you, remember what is important. Your belief that you are receiving Jesus, not just a symbol, that you are in the state of sanctifying grace and that you have prepared yourself to receive Jesus.
