New Changes for our Monthly Council <u>Meeting Attendance Drawing</u>

We will be changing our attendance drawing beginning in August. This drawing was started early on in our council's history to encourage attendance, but seems to have lost its effectiveness. So let's try something new. Here are the new parameters of the drawing:

- Anyone who wants to enter the drawing will contribute \$1 to a pot and put their name on a card for the drawing. No pressure to be in.
- At the end of the meeting, we will draw a name from those contributing \$1.
- That person wins 50% of the pot.
- The winner will then draw one card from a deck of cards. If they draw an ace, they win the other half of the pot.
- If they do not draw an ace, the other half goes into the next month's drawing. Thus, the next month's pot has a good chance of growing.
- If there is an odd dollar amount in the pot, we will round up to the next dollar. Thus, a \$25 pot will get the winner \$13 with a chance to win the other \$12.

Let's look at a couple of examples:

- 22 Knights each put \$1 in the pot. Gary Hennessey's name is drawn. Gary wins half the pot, or \$11. He comes up and draws an Ace. Thus he wins the other half of the pot for a total of \$22.
- 22 Knights each put \$1 in the pot. Gary Hennessey's name is drawn. He comes up and draws something other than an Ace. Thus he wins half the pot \$11. The other \$11 goes into the next month's drawing. At the next month's drawing, 26 Knights put \$1 in that drawing, the pot is then up to \$37 (\$11 + \$26). The winner will win \$19 and have the chance to win the remaining \$18.

The objective is to blend in a little fun (maybe we will have a lottery sized drawing someday) and get lots of attendance! We will also try and post the current carryover amounts in the newsletter

• A short description of why you believe this person or group represents the Spirit of St. Vincent de Paul and emulates our patron saint's work with and for marginalized populations.


• Description of the actions the individual has taken to assist those who are disadvantages or underserved.


