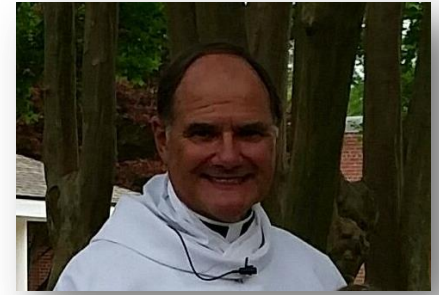

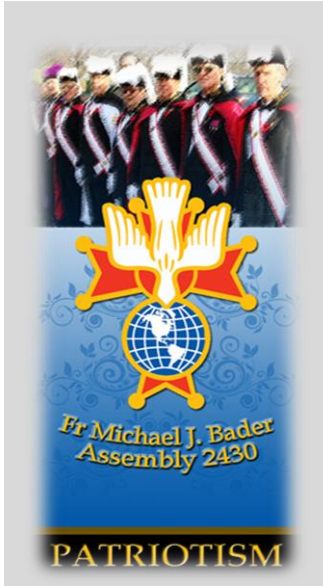

Volunteering to Support SPRED

SPRED Partners of Virginia, Inc. is looking for volunteers to serve in existing Special Religious Development (SPRED) communities in the Diocese of Richmond, and we also invite parishes to consider becoming part of the SPRED Network.

What is SPRED? SPRED is an Agency of the Archdiocese of Chicago, commissioned to help parishes welcome adults and children with developmental disabilities and/or alternative ways of learning. SPRED communities are growing around the world, including in the Diocese of Richmond. As a resource for parishes, SPRED Chicago provides materials, observation, training, enrichment opportunities, mentoring, and a network of support to volunteers and families.

What is a SPRED Community? Up to 8 volunteers for each SPRED small community within a parish agree to complete training to learn this method of formation for children and adults with developmental disabilities and different learning needs. Each parish will have a chairperson, and each small community within the parish will have one activity catechist and one leader catechist. The chairperson, activity catechist(s), and leader catechist(s) will form a core leadership team for the parish. Each of up to 6 helper catechists supports a disabled Friend. The core team and helper catechists in each parish SPRED community form a faith community, entering into friendship with up to 6 friends with disabilities. SPRED Communities fall strictly into these age groups: 6-10 years, 11-16 years, 17-21 years, 22+ years. A parish may choose to host a small community with members of one of these age groups. SPRED Partners of Virginia, Inc. encourages parishes throughout the Diocese to form a SPRED Network so that the needs of Friends in each age group are met. The faith community agrees to follow the Standards of Affiliation with the SPRED Agency.

What is the SPRED process? SPRED uses a method of symbolic catechesis with a carefully formed environment to help people with disabilities grow in awareness of God in their lives and of their dignity as loved by God and as integral parts of the parish community and the entire Church. In SPRED communities of faith, catechists and friends develop meaningful relationships. The quiet, sacred beautifully prepared space, the friendships, the sharing of life experiences, the proclamation of the Word, and the Sacramental celebrations, help each member of the community become aware of God in our midst as we discover the gifts and needs of every person in the small community.

What is the time commitment? Volunteers commit to 24 SPRED Sessions, once a week, each year, as well as to the training, specific to their role. There may be other liturgical and social opportunities to celebrate as a SPRED community throughout the year too.

Who can volunteer? People 21 years or older are invited to inquire about volunteering in a small SPRED community in a parish. No prior experience with people with disabilities is necessary. Parishes are invited to inquire about starting small SPRED communities of their own.

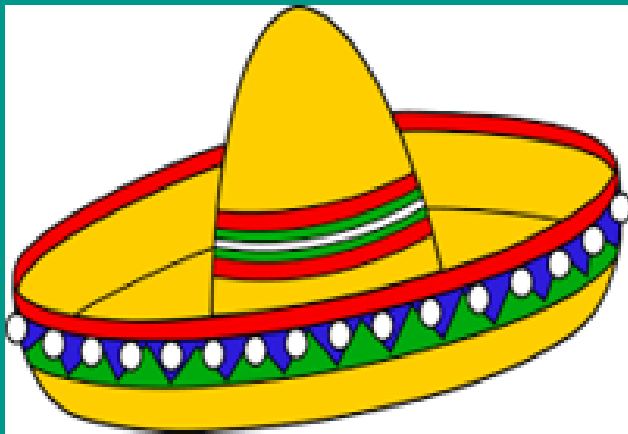
Doors open & coffee ready at 7:30 AM,

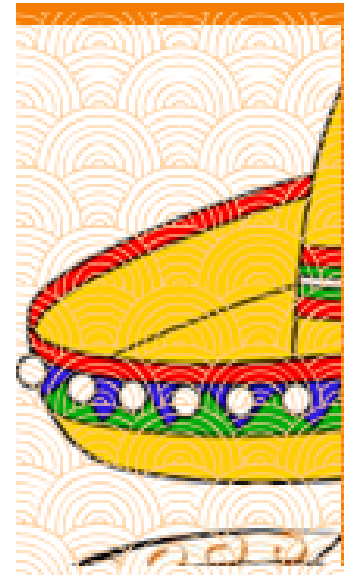
