Chaplain's Reflection Heaven and Earth

The Ascension of Jesus is a theologically important, even though often overlooked, aspect of the life of Christ. Although the Ascension marks the completion of Christ's physical presence on earth, it also celebrates the continuing human work of Jesus in the present age.

Jesus is indeed present with us through the Holy Spirit and He continues His work in this world, dwelling within our hearts and acting through the body, eyes, hands and feet of each one of us. Yet Jesus will remain physically absent from us until his return at the end of time.

The Ascension of Jesus requires that we think differently about the relationship between heaven and earth and how we think about the Church and our salvation. Through the Ascension, Jesus has preceded us into God's space, God's new world. As King of the Universe, Christ rules over our rebellious present world, both the good and the bad.

Despite the optimistic beliefs of 18th century Enlightenment philosophers and our modern secular humanist culture, human progress will never eliminate evil because only Christ has power over evil. Man is nothing without God. So to embrace the Ascension is to heave a sigh of relief, to give up the struggle to be like God; the same struggle that brought about the original sin of Adam and Eve.

We can then enjoy our status as creatures made in the image and likeness of God, called to a "perfection in charity" and to be holy people, whom the Lord has made little less than a god, crowned with glory and honor, and given rule over the works of His hands (cf Ps 8:6-7).

Jesus is both Son of God and Son of Man, divine and human. His return to His Father means that there is a human being, the God-man ruling over this world in this present age. But even as Jesus sits at the right hand of the Father in heaven, He remains present with us through the Holy Spirit and the sacraments and He continues to act in the present age through our bodies, hands, feet and eyes.

Jesus still has the same resurrected and glorified body first seen by Mary Magdalene and last seen by the apostles prior to His Ascension. Even though Jesus is now absent from this present world, Jesus is actually more human than we are because in His glorified human body, He is the "new Adam," the "perfection" of man.

The Ascension is a mystery. To embrace it demands that we rethink our understanding of heaven, where God resides, and earth, where we reside. When the Bible speaks of heaven and earth it is not talking about two localities related to each other within the **same** space-time continuum, nor is it talking about a non-physical world contrasted with a physical one. Instead, heaven and earth are **two different kinds** of what we call space, matter and time.

God's space and ours, heaven and earth, though very different, are not far from each other. God's space and ours interlock and intersect in a variety of ways, though for now they retain their separate and distinct identities. One day we'll be joined to God's space in a new way through the beatific vision, open and visible to one another, married together forever at the great Supper of the Lamb.

So Jesus has not ascended to some other place for us to meet him at the end of time. Rather, Scripture makes it very clear that Jesus is now in heaven, in God's space, ruling the whole world and the whole universe. One day he will *return to join our space with God's space* to make that rule complete.

When you hear the words Notre Dame what comes to mind? Probably you think of the Catholic university in South Bend, IN. However, there is the very famous Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. It dates from the 12th century and took 180 years to construct. It is 226 feet high with 30 flying buttresses and three famous large stained glass windows with sculptures and religious paintings inside. It is situated on an island in the Seine River. If you take a sight-seeing boat from the foot of the Eiffel Tower it will pass the Grand Palace, the Louve Museum, Napoleon's tomb and stop at the island to let persons off wishing to visit the cathedral.

In the nearby Montmarte District is Sacre Coeur Basilica, another famous Roman Catholic church dedicated to the 58,000 who died in World War I. Since 1885, the Blessed Sacrament has been on continual display in a monstrance over the High Altar. It also holds sculptures of Saint Joan of Arc on a horse and King Saint Louis IX. The bell tower holds a 19-ton Savoyarde bell. The basilica's high elevated position affords a magnificent panoramic view of Paris, the City of Light.

Are you familiar with S.O.M.E? In 1970, Fr. Horace McKenna, S.J., founded So Others May Eat. St. John the Evangelist Parish has supported this charitable endeavor for many years now. Ms. Sue Wiant, the new president of the Maryknights, together with her daughter Morgan and Jane Welsh, collect food donations every second Tuesday of the month at St. John's and transport everything to the Mission at 71 O St and North Capitol near the National Shrine. Between 400 and 500 people are fed breakfast and a hot lunch every day of the year. Rosensteel Council strongly supports the pastor, Fr. Joseph Calis, and St. John the Evangelist parish's charitable contribution. Your personal food donations are welcome at 9 a.m. every second Tuesday of the month.

Do you believe in the power of prayer? Have you ever prayed for something or someone to receive the Lord's blessing? Perhaps an interesting question is, "Were your prayers answered?" In the city of Padova, Italy, in the Basilica of St. Anthony, there is a wall with hundreds of letters, handwritten notes and photographs of people. The first impression is that this a memorial wall to people who have had tragic deaths. But, quite the contrary, they are from people who have survived accidents, injuries and medical problems and attribute their good fortune to prayers offered to St. Anthony.
