## **Faith Formation**

Some of the changes that are occurring are in the Faith formation area. Deacon Kevin is now responsible for RCIA program, Religious Education, and even training the candidates for Deacon of the Diocese, a very full plate indeed. He will be guiding the parish in Formed topics as well. (You will be able to find the area of study on the front page of this document every month- Lower Left). I have had to privilege to sit in on a number of meetings for the RCIA programs now, and it seems to be taking shape although more people are always needed.

The format will be more individualistic, there will no longer be a set time period for those wanting to join the church. Their entry will be based on grasping those concepts that make us Catholic; it may take three months or three years and will depend on how much they put into it. After an initial interview they are placed with a mentor who will then act as a guide through the process. The lessons are segmented into basic ideas that are either worked through by the mentor and candidate, or taught by volunteers each Sunday. Hospitality is provided to those classes by more volunteers (Our council among them. We will provide meals to the class on all Parish Breakfast Sundays. Logistics of this have not been decided yet). The main idea is for candidates to see lots of different faces from our community and not the same ones week after week.

This is where the challenge comes in because those faces need to be able to answer questions when they are asked, something that all of us in the Council should be able to do but sometimes are lacking. I will end my description on that note, before I out myself as the heathen I am. If you have an interest please get with Deacon Kevin and offer him your help.

We have waited a long time for Father Jim to tell us what he might want us to provide for the church. We had gone back and forth for a while with none of our clergy wanting to get nailed down to something. All you had to do was read the bulletin to see that Father Jim had started to request changes that individual donors were stepping up and taking care of; almost before we ever heard they were wanted. I felt like it was time to go try to talk to Father Jim about what we might provide for the church. So one Sunday when I had the opportunity to grab Father Jim after he finished confessions we had a talk. I explained that we were there for him and that we really wanted to provide something visible that we could point to and say we provided and that had our name on it.

He immediately started to talk about the statues of Joseph and Mary. He felt that the minimalistic style of our current statues did not present the image of our Blessed Mother and Joseph in an inspiring way. Many of you may not feel that way, and view them simply as statues, but maybe that is the problem. What I do know is they will get done with or without us and I would prefer that it be with. I researched a number of statues and then ran them by an interior design consultant that Father Jim had worked with at St Maria Goretti. This opportunity presented itself at the right time and allowed me to pick the best to but in front of Father (I found a few that had much bigger price tags). The statues pictured are some that I found on the east coast, PA of all places and our expensive, Mary \$4,400 and Joseph \$6,800. These prices do not include packing and freight for each plaster statue that weighs about 70 lbs. (cont.)

(cont. from previous) We are not locked into these, other than style and size, and if someone comes up with something similar at less cost I would welcome that, but until that point I will proceed on with these. It should go without saying that we do not have that much saved so put on your fundraising hats and let me know if you are interested in working on the committee that will be formed. This gives us something to raise funds for and there could be more things that are needed before it is all said and done.



# Parish Construction and Moving

The Capital project is moving along and we have some dates that we need to be aware of concerning our equipment. If you have been keeping a careful eye, you have seen the storage building on the Northeast corner of the property. That will be the new home of everything that is in the garage behind the pastoral center. The Smoker will have a different home. more about that later. The Storage building will be done sometime mid-September. It is waiting on overhead doors and some light interior finish out. Once the contractor is able to get a Certificate of Occupancy (CO) or a Temporary CO which sometimes becomes necessary, we will be on the clock to move our equipment.

The Smoker will be moving into a fenced in enclosure in front of the white elephant (warehouse behind

the food pantry) so when you see the fencing start to go up we will be close.

Lastly the new Pastoral Center will be completed around the beginning of November and we have been asked to assist in the move from the old offices to the new. The date for that is November 10 which is one week after our first major degree and Veterans Day weekend. We will put out more information on this in the future but save the date, oil up your dollies, and dust off anything that you might have that will assist us to make the day move along quickly.

The new rectory will be to the east of our new storage building and plans are stuck at the city last I heard



# First Request from Father Jim



We found out Wednesday that


