## **Chaplain's Reflection Engage the Heart before the Mouth**

In a gospel passage from Matthew (12:1-8), we hear that the disciples of Jesus were going through a field of grain and picking heads of grain to eat. This was a common practice in Israel at the time. But the Pharisees immediately seized on the fact that it was the Sabbath to complain that this was unlawful. The Pharisees assumed the disciples were harvesting as opposed to simply getting something to satisfy their current hunger.

It's easy to see the fault in the Pharisees in this passage, but it is harder to see it ourselves. When we see things other people are doing that bother us we want justice and so we rush to judgment. And in rushing to judgment, we have no sense of mercy or understanding. No consideration of any benefit of the doubt.

For instance, how many times have we been driving down the road and we pull up behind a car that is not going fast enough. We might be tempted to shake our fist at it and call him or her a Sunday driver or worse, or maybe endanger everyone around us by making a risky pass. But we still don't know why the driver is driving slowly. He or she could have a really good reason.

So Jesus' chastisement of the Pharisees regarding enforcement of the Sabbath shows us the need to always show mercy and understanding to others. The truth of the matter is that Jesus always brings heart to the law. Jesus brings humaneness to the law, the commandments and everything that He is teaching.

Jesus points out that it was "unlawful" for the revered King David and his companions to eat bread offerings in the House of God simply because they were not temple priests. Yet it was somehow lawful for the temple priests to eat that same bread on the Sabbath. So Jesus brings his wonderful warmth and says, wait a minute, we're talking about human beings, we're talking about human actions. The purpose of the law was not to let people go hungry simply because they were not of the priestly class.

In the same way, whenever we think someone else is doing something unjust like not following rules of the Road, not going fast enough to suit us, we should

remember that we do not know what they are going through at that moment. And that's where Jesus always invites us to be merciful, compassionate and understanding.

There are reasons why people do what they do. We're not in their heads. We're not able to see their thoughts or understand exactly what's happening. And yet, sometimes we become so judgmental, so strong in pointing out someone else's faults. That they're not doing it right, they're not going fast enough, they should be doing this or they should be doing that.

Jesus always brings a concerning heart and a love for people. And he invites us as his disciples to do the same. So next time we feel the urge to seek justice, instead of engaging the mouth first what we should do is start with the mind thinking about what we're going to say. Bring it down to the heart, feel what we want to say and then engage the mouth. Not the opposite way around which so often we do.

Too often we engage the mouth first. And then later, we feel bad about what we say because we discover the truth of why a person is doing what they are doing. So we should just engage the mind and use some wisdom, and then bring it to the heart and allow the heart to be with it before we engage our lips. Actually, that will help us a lot because too often we engage the mouth without ever connecting the heart or using a little wisdom.

Dear Maryknights,

Our Maryknights officers are busy working with the focus groups tasked with considering your responses to the recent survey to harvest potential tweaks to current activities and new ideas to ensure that the Maryknights continue their impressive history of compassionate community involvement and support of the Rosensteel Council. You should be receiving the president's letter this month. It will provide information on how our meetings may be structured based on where we are regarding COVID-19 restrictions in Montgomery County. I am happy to be writing the newsletter this year. In addition to what is directly happening with the Maryknights, I plan on providing for your consideration a reflection on a saint celebrated in the current month, or a reflection on stewardship, which we are all called to practice in our faith. While August has an abundance of saints to consider and includes the Transfiguration and the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, with the assistance of information and reflection provided by Franciscan Media I ask your consideration of the less known Saint Joan of the Cross. Born in 1666 in France, Joan worked in the family shop and eventually took over after her parents died. She quickly became known for her greediness and insensitivity to the beggars who often came seeking help until one day she was touched by a strange woman who claimed she was on intimate terms with the deity. Following this encounter Joan became a new person. She began caring for needy children. Then the poor, elderly and sick came to her. She eventually closed the family business and devoted herself fully to good works and penance. She went on to found the Congregation of Saint Anne of Providence, taking the religious name of Joan of the Cross. Before she died in 1736 she founded 12 religious houses, hospices and schools. Pope John Paul II canonized her in 1982.

The downtown areas of most major cities hold a population of "street people." Well-dressed folks usually avoid making eye contact, probably for fear of being asked for a handout. That was Joan's attitude until the day one of them touched her heart. Most people thought the old woman was crazy, but she put Joan on the road to sainthood. Who knows what the next beggar we meet might do for us?
