

Knights of Columbus Sets Record for Charity and Service in 2014

The Knights of Columbus set a new all-time record last year for charitable donations and service hours with \$173,550,680 in donations and more than 71.5 million hours of service. The number of service hours rose more than a million hours over the previous year's total. Donations grew by more than \$3.4 million since 2013, achieving an increase in giving for the 15th consecutive year. (Did you know that our council gave over \$50,000 to charitable organizations last year).

Among its major donations in 2014, the Knight of Columbus made a gift of \$1.4 million to this summer's Special Olympics World Games in Los Angeles. Another unique initiative in 2014 was the Knights of Columbus Christian Refugee Relief Fund, which has contributed \$2.6 million for humanitarian assistance in Iraq and the surrounding region.

Gifts by the Knights of \$200,000 each were also made to the Byzantine and Latin Rite Catholic communities of war-torn Ukraine for humanitarian relief, supporting projects that feed and aid homeless children and refugees living on the streets of the capital city of Kiev.

The Knights continued to support their local communities in 2014. Council 802 supported our local community with Coats for Kids, Special Olympics, Hospital Visits, Prison Ministry, Habitat for Humanity, Iron Wheels, Pro Life, and many, many more in addition to the cash donations mentioned above.

Brother Knights,

I have completed the two month Institute for Priestly Formation in Omaha, Nebraska. To describe this as a great experience would be to underestimate the abundant graces that I received from the Lord through this program.

I'd like to share with you a part of a talk I gave to some IPF supporters at the end of my time in Omaha. I was speaking about my experience of my mother's death and how IPF helped me to heal and grow from that experience.

We all have our share of tragedy, and as faithful Catholics I know how much you depend on your priests to give you faith and hope during times of trial. In these moments, what kind of priest do you want to show up? The men in the seminary with me have stories much like my own, just like all of us they have pasts that need healing, and if they don't get healed in the seminary, then instead of getting a spiritual physician at your door, you may get a wounded man who has not allowed God's healing love into his life and therefore can't bring it into your life.

What kind of priest do you want? This is important because there is a choice here. IPF has given me great confidence that one day I will be the type of priest that the Church deserves, the type of priest that each of you deserve. I believe in IPF, the men that come here leave forever changed, they become beacons of God's love and a source of great comfort to all that they encounter. That's what God asks us to do as priests, and that is what we learn to do here, good priests don't grow on trees, but they do grow at IPF.

I can't wait to see all of you soon before I go back to New Orleans, God Bless.

Dear friends,




"Slain Troops in Chattanooga Saved Lives Before Giving Their Own" / This was one of the headlines in The New York Times on July 22nd, 2015. The article expresses the bravery of law enforcement and our men and women in uniform to save so many lives by distracting the gunman that brought gunfire in their direction instead of the larger crowd. Please keep ALL of our law enforcement, our military and their families in your prayers for the sacrifices they give for our freedom.

Additional news making headlines has Louisiana Gov. Bobby Jindal launching a state investigation by Department of Health and Hospitals into the operations of Planned Parenthood, based on reports alleging some of its affiliates are using partial birth abortions to sell fetal body parts. This is alarming to us because the same organization is seeking to open an abortion clinic in New Orleans.

I started listening and watching these posted videos and they were so bad I could not watch more than a couple of minutes. It is so bad; I decided NOT to include any links to these videos within my article. They are actually putting a price on body parts. Averaged out, Planned Parenthood does approximately one abortion every 97 seconds and some of your tax dollars are being funneled to this organization. According to stopp.org, Planned Parenthood has been receiving government funding for decades. In fact, STOPP has data that can be traced back to the 1960s. Their records show that Planned Parenthood has received over \$4.8 BILLION in taxpayer money.

I received the following letter from Thad Cochran in answer to my letter to him

Dear Mr. Hober:

Thank you for your correspondence regarding abortion.

On July 22, 2015, I joined 49 other Senators in writing to the Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS) to express our expectation that HHS not only cooperate with Congressional investigations but also undertake its own review of Planned Parenthood's compliance with applicable federal statutes and regulations related to abortion. The footage raises a number of questions about the practices of the organization, and there should be a thorough examination into whether federal laws and policies are being violated. The harvesting of fetal organs for profit is not only repugnant, it is illegal.

I am opposed to any measure that could encourage abortion as a matter of federal law or policy. My voting record continues to earn a 100% score from National Right to Life based on my firm stance on protecting the lives of unborn children. I am a supporter of pro-life legislation restricting federal funds for abortions and banning late-term abortions, including the No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion and Abortion Insurance Full Disclosure Act of 2015 and the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act. Should the Senate consider legislation related to Planned Parenthood or abortion, I will keep your thoughts in mind.


