My Brother Knights,

Invitations will be sent out as a reminder. This is an opportunity for Unity and Fraternity open to council members only unless there is an approved special guest.

Our Chaplains, Father Anthony Senyah and Father John Asare have challenged us to be more involved in the parishes in support of social justice ministries. We will need to be more creative in our strategies to fundraise, program, recruit, and meet. Your involvement and ideas are essential. Supreme Council conducts the exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity online by invitation on a regular basis in English, Spanish, and French. I invite our first and second degree knights to learn all the principles of our Order and advance. Additionally, we need to recruit and retain members. Now is the time.

#### Message from the Supreme Knight - 7/15/2020

#### Brother Knights:

We are all aware of the troubling events that are occurring today, including attacks on statues of historical figures such as Abraham Lincoln, Frederick Douglass and our Order's namesake, Christopher Columbus. Statues of saints have also been vandalized, including those honoring St. Junípero Serra, St. Louis and even the Blessed Virgin Mary, and houses of worship and other religious symbols have been attacked. These are not merely attacks on statues and history. They are increasingly attacks on Catholics and people of faith.

In the late 19th century, the Knights of Columbus took its name at a time of intense anti-Catholicism. Our founding members wanted to show that Catholics played an essential role in the exploration and development of America since its earliest days, and that a Catholic could be both a good citizen and a good Catholic.

However, anti-Catholicism persisted. In the 1920s, the Ku Klux Klan tried to stop Columbus Day celebrations and opposed Columbus statues simply because Columbus was a Catholic. We opposed the KKK then and have continued to stand up against bigotry directed at Catholics and others.

We stood up against the persecution of Catholics in Mexico in the 1920s, spoke out for the Jews of Germany in the 1930s and worked for religious freedom behind the Iron Curtain during the Cold War. Today, we are rebuilding Christian communities in the Middle East that were targeted for genocide. Each of us can be proud of our history of standing up for the most vulnerable among us.

While our faith calls us to be respectful of different perspectives, acts of vandalism are crimes against all who cherish democracy and mutual respect. The Knights of Columbus remains firm in its condemnation of all forms of racism and violence, including political violence. With churches, statues, and religious symbols subject to vandalism and attack, we call upon elected officials and leaders at every level to defend the religious freedom of all.

#### Message from the State Deputy - 7/16/2020

Worthy Brothers,

Many of you may have already received this message that our Supreme Knight Carl Anderson sent yesterday; however, I wanted to ensure everyone on our Virginia State Council distribution lists has received it. I join with all Brother Knights who speak out against racism, injustice, and violence, including anti-Catholic discrimination. For decades, the Ku Klux Klan and other hate groups have spread misinformation about and besmirched the reputation of Columbus as part of their campaign against Catholics and Italians. Unfortunately, their lies have become accepted as fact among many outside of these hate groups, including some of our own Brother Knights.

As I stated during the Virginia State Council Organizational Meeting last month, I want Virginia Knights to defend our namesake and that defense begins with educating ourselves about the facts and myths. Was Christopher Columbus a perfect person? No, he wasn't. Did he make mistakes? Yes, he did. Was he a murderer

and rapist? There's no documented evidence of these crimes and historical accounts written by the inhabitants of Hispaniola dispute what many have incorrectly accepted as fact.

#### The Month of August is devoted to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

The Church dedicates the month of August to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It is a dogma of the Catholic faith that Mary is the Immaculate Conception; that is, in preparation for the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Holy Trinity in her womb, she was conceived without the corruption of sin through the infinite merits of her Son, Jesus Christ. Over the centuries, as saints and theologians reflected on how Mary pondered and treasured the sacred events from the life of Christ in her holy heart, as attested in Scripture, her pure heart was recognized as something to be imitated. Devotion to Our Lady's purity of heart began to flower, culminating in St. John Eudes promoting it in the 17th century alongside that of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion rose to a new level after the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima, when Mary revealed an image of her Immaculate Heart to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco.

Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney: The Father McGivney Guild promotes the cause for canonization of our founder: Father Michael J. McGivney. The goal of the Guild is to spread the good word about his holiness of life, to encourage devotion to his memory, and to seek his intercession before the throne of God. The Guild serves as a clearinghouse for information about Father McGivney, his life and works, and any favors attributed to his intercession. Father McGivney is a unique model for today's Catholic and today's Catholic priest because of his attention to the social ills and injustices of his day and his collaboration with the laity. He was zealous for the life of union with God through prayer and the sacraments, and he would have been right at home in today's world. He was then and would be today an eager apostle for the Gospel of life, and a determined foe of the culture of death. There is no cost to join the Guild, but donations are welcome. \*Note: Venerable Servant of God Father Michael McGivney would not be the first member of the Knights of Columbus to be canonized. A group of six Mexican members of our organization were martyred during the Cristero War of 1926-1929 and its aftermath. The six are St. Luis Batis, St. Rodrigo Aguilar, St. Miguel de la Mora, St. Pedro de Jesús Maldonado, St. José María Robles, and St. Mateo Correa.


Message from our Worthy State Deputy:
