## Out Live Your Life by Max Lucado

**M**ax Lucado hits yet another home run with his forthcoming book, Out Live Your Life! I want to paraphrase his powerful introduction: 'These are difficult days in our world's history. Billions of people are poor, millions go hungry or thirsty every day. Disease claims thousands of lives daily. But you and I have been given an opportunity to make a big difference. What if we did? What if we rocked the world with hope? Infiltrated all corners with God's love and life? We are created by a great God to do great works; He invites us to outlive our lives, not just in Heaven, but here on earth. Let's live our life in such a way that the world will be glad we did.

Lucado walks us through the first twelve chapters of Acts, where we see, firsthand, how a few faithful people can change the world. In his motivational way, Max challenges us to make this happen again!

The thing I find compelling about Max Lucado's works, is that he keeps his ideas simple and ties them into lessons directly from the Bible. In this way, it makes it easy to see how we can live our lives more biblically. His writing style is always fast flowing, making his books a quick read, but ones that you want to keep in your personal library for reference and reflection. In Lucado, we find hope, as well as direction – reaching into what we have already been taught, in terms of values and morals, to try to make a difference every day.

# **The First Labor Day**

The first Labor Day holiday was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City, in accordance with the plans of the Central Labor Union. The Central Labor Union held its second Labor Day holiday just a year later, on September 5, 1883.

In 1884 the first Monday in September was selected as the holiday, as originally proposed, and the Central Labor Union urged similar organizations in other cities to follow the example of New York and celebrate a "workingmen's holiday" on that date. The idea spread with the growth of labor organizations, and in 1885 Labor Day was celebrated in many industrial centers of the country.
