President's Message:

Brother Knights and Friends,

As I write this article, it is mid-August. Summer is winding down and schools are back in session. I hope all of you had the opportunity to enjoy some vacation time to relax, refresh, and revitalize.

An Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose is currently in the Chicago Archdiocese. Our Silver Rose began its journey on March 4, in Manitoba, Canada, and will end its journey on December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, in Mexico. Our first Silver Rose Prayer Service was held today at St. Francis DeSales Parish in Lake Zurich. Although I did not have the opportunity to attend, I have heard that Fr. David F. Ryan gave a wonderful homily on Pro-Life and the Knights of Columbus. I am sure that the remaining Silver Rose Prayer Services will also be wonderful experiences for all the attendees.

In my last article I listed a number of goals for the Chicago Archdiocesan Chapter for the 2019 – 2020 fraternal. The reminder of this article is devoted to one of those goals, Promote "March For Kids" to Benefit Mercy Home for Boys and Girls.

There are parallels between the founding of our Order and the founding of Mercy Home. One of Fr. McGivney's goals in founding the Knights in 1882 was to provide for the families of deceased members. In 1887 Archbishop Patrick Feehan, a native of Tipperary, Ireland, convened a

group of priests and pressed them for a solution to the growing crisis of homeless boys who filled the city's most dangerous streets. Both the Knights and Mercy Home are Catholic organizations that serve to protect some of the most vulnerable members of our society.

Mercy Home is incorporated as a distinct organization within the Catholic Archdiocese of Chicago. It is the second largest charity in the archdiocese. The largest is Catholic Charities. However, unlike Catholic Charities, Mercy Home does not receive financial support from the archdiocese. 99% of Mercy Home's financing comes from private donations.

Mercy Home cares for 900 adolescents and young adults. There is a boy's campus in the West Loop and a girl's campus in the Beverly neighborhood. In addition, through its AfterCare Program, Mercy Home supports adults throughout the city. Mercy Home pays the high school tuition for each young adult in its care whether Catholic, public, or private.

"March For Kids" is financially "pass-through" for a council. It requires no funds from the council. Mercy Home provides all the necessary items – cans, aprons, and Shamrock pins. Funds raised are deposited in the council's bank account. The council then issues a check to Mercy Home.

"March for Kids" is generally run on a parish level. The following steps are involved.

- Get the Pastor's permission to solicit donations after Masses one weekend in March.
- Run bulletin and pulpit announcements promoting the "March fort Kids".

- Mercy Home can supply the announcements
- Solicit volunteers to collect the donations. A general rule of thumb is four (4) volunteers per Mass
- Request the number of cans, aprons, and Shamrock pins that will be needed. A general rule of thumb is four (4) cans, four (4) aprons, and 500 Shamrock pins.

If a council cannot obtain the Pastor's permission to collect donations following weekend Masses, there are other ways the council can solicit donations.

- St. Patrick's / St. Joseph's Day Parties
- Lenten Fish Fries
- Other council activities

The campaign is meant to be executed during March. However, when necessary, councils can push it back into late February or forward into early April.

The September Chicago Archdiocesan Chapter meeting will be held on September 26 at 7:30 PM. The location will be Mercy Home's West Loop Campus, 1140 W Jackson Blvd, Chicago, IL 60607. This will be an informational / kickoff meeting for the 2020 "March For Kids".

Representatives from Mercy Home will have a short presentation and be available to answer your questions. All District Deputies and Grand Knights are cordially invented to attend. I urge each of you to attend or send a representative.

Mercy Home serves some of the most vulnerable members of our society – orphaned, abandoned, neglected, and abused adolescents and young adults. Strong collaboration between

Father Michael J. McGivney, assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, CT, founded the Knights of Columbus, in 1882, as a fraternal benefit society. The Order is still true to its founding principles of charity, unity and fraternity. The Knights was formed to render financial aid to members and their families. Mutual aid and assistance are offered to sick, disabled and needy members and their families.

Times haven't changed much since 1882. There are still families in need, and the Knights of Columbus is there to render assistance. We have partnered with Hanover Township Food Pantry for many years to help provide food to families in need. This is our 6th Annual Knights Challenge 5K, which benefits the food pantry directly.

On **October 5th**, runners, walkers, and school-age kids will assemble at St. John's Parish Center to help us in our quest to Feed His Sheep. Registration is open online and in the parish office. 11th September marks anniversary of the terrorist attacks on the United States. On that anniversary, we recall the thousands who lost their lives on that tragic day. At its annual meeting in 2004, the Supreme Council passed a resolution that September 11th be observed each year as a *World Day of Prayer for Peace*.

Labor Day, is a legal holiday celebrated on the first Monday in September in the United States, Puerto Rico, the Canal Zone, and the Virgin Islands.

The celebration of Labor Day, in honor of the working class, it was first suggested by Peter J. McGuire, founder of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters.

It was initiated in the U.S. in 1882 by the Knights of Labor, who held a large parade in New York City.

In 1884 the group held a parade on the first Monday of September and passed a resolution to hold all future parades on that day and to designate the day as Labor Day.

In 1894 the U.S. Congress made the day a legal holiday. Parades, and speeches by labor leaders and political figures, mark Labor Day celebrations.

FAITH IN ACTION ROSARY PROGRAM



The Knights of Columbus Rosary Program provides an opportunity to build faithful families and parishes through the Rosary. Rosary Prayer Services helps us grow in our devotion to Mary, the patroness of our Order, along with emphasizing the importance of prayer. As an Order, our Faith in Action program is an invitation to all Knights and their families to live out their faith along with an opportunity to evangelize as we continue to build God's Kingdom right here on earth.

To get started a Chairman should be appointed. The Chairman should meet with the Pastor for the possibility of hosting a Rosary Prayer Service inviting all parishioners and include the possibility of a regular monthly service, or a Fifth Sunday Rosary service. The Chairman will need to order the Rosary Program Kit and promote each Rosary Prayer Service by reaching out to all local media.

Once you have obtained your Pastor's permission, seek any recommendations he may have on conducting the service. Provide a bulletin and pulpit announcement for your Pastor's approval. Try to use every opportunity to build public interest. You can promote the program by posting the service on your Council and Parrish websites, and with local media releases. You can locate a sample press release through Supreme, along with promotional posters from the Rosary Program kit.

As always, the program is not completed until the paperwork is completed. To gain credit for participation the reporting forms will need to submit to Supreme Council Department of Fraternal Mission.


