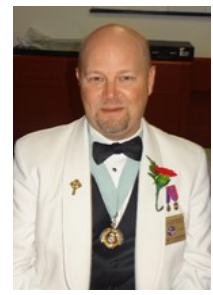

### 2. Increase fundraising by 100%

- Again numbers are not yet final and will not be until our audit is completed in August; however, I would estimate we are at approximately 25% mostly attributable to new events and record revenues of most existing events.
- Due to the incredible efforts of this council and the relationship forged by Brian Dennis with the IBEW, we are in line to add two additional events this year: a Crab Feast and a Christmas Party. All great news and more planned!

### 3. Become 100% digital

- Some progress, but frankly not what I would have expected. We now have a fully functional contact data base housed by Supreme, so we have certainly made a step in the right direction in protecting your privacy data. Although numerous hours were spent updating the Supreme database we can do so much more not only with member data but benefactors and supporters as well. More to come!
- You can help in helping us attain this goal, I have been sending updates over the last few weeks via the email database at Supreme, **if you are not receiving these it is because we don't have a valid email address for you on file. ### 4. Increase insurance members by 25%

- This is an area where we can and should improve. In fact we had problems just attaining our 7.5% goal, but we did make it by the skin of our teeth. This is a personal decision and one that no other brother can help you with. Just keep in mind why our Order was founded and if you are comfortable with where you are today.
- Take the opportunity, at no cost to you, to invite our new field agent, Mark Goldberg, into your home to conduct a personal review and explain all fraternal benefits. You may be pleasantly surprised.
- Perhaps those in their golden years or many of those just having a better than average year, may want to consider 'paying it forward' with a small policy or annuity for your church or council.
- We have a new field agent assigned to our council this year, Mark Goldberg. Mark has promised me that he is committed to meet with anyone in our council who would like a review and all new or recently transferred members. You can expect quality and timely service.

As I stated last year these goals are lofty but achievable! Look at the progress after just one year. To get there we will continue to need the help of all council members to get involved. There is always something for everyone to do. Your commitment depends on your personal situation, but you will find much satisfaction in helping others in your parish and community.
