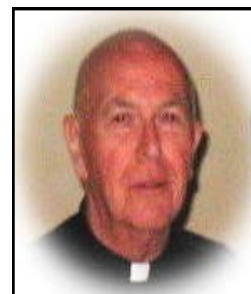

Chaplain's Message - Father Oscar Frundt

First Sunday of Advent - November 30, 2014

Advent is an important four-week period that involves spending time in spiritual preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ at Christmas. It should be a season of prayer, fasting and repentance, followed by anticipation, hope and joy.

Advent is a time to reflect and prepare for Christmas similar to how Lent is a preparation for Easter. Advent has sometimes called the "Winter Lent" or "Little Lent".



Purple is historically the main color used for Advent because it reflects penitence, fasting, and is the color of royalty to welcome the coming of the King (Jesus Christ). The focus of the entire season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his first Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ as King in his second Advent.

As during Lent, priests wear purple vestments, and the Gloria ("Glory to God") is omitted during Mass. The only exception is on the Third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudete Sunday, when priests wear rose-colored vestments. As on Laetare Sunday during Lent, this exception is designed to encourage us to continue our prayer and fasting, because we can see that Advent is more than halfway over.

Perhaps the best-known of all Advent symbols is the Advent Wreath, which consists of four candles (three purple and one pink) arranged in a circle with evergreen boughs. The Advent wreath corresponds to the four Sundays of Advent. The purple candles represent the penitential nature of the season, while the pink candle calls to mind the Gaudete Sunday.



In the busy weeks ahead as we prepare for Christmas, let us not lose sight of the true meaning of Christmas, the birth of our Lord and Savior. Let make certain that as Catholic families we are prepared to welcome the Christ Child in our hearts. Let us keep remember that Jesus is the reason for the season.

I want to wish all my Brother Knights and their families a blessed Christmas, and much health and happiness in the New Year. I will remember you all in my Christmas Mass. God bless you and your families!
