Chaplain's Message - Father OscarFrundt

Tri Memoriam



October 1, 1927 - April 13, 2015

Father Oscar H. Frundt was Chaplain of Christopher Council, No. 3182. Father also served as Chaplain of the Delaware State Police for 51 years and is the first chaplain in its 88-year history to attain the honorary rank of colonel. Father was a Life Member of the Knights of Columbus. He joined the Order in 1956 and received the honors of the Fourth Degree in 1985. Sir Knight Rev. Frundt was a member of Archbishop Edmond J. Fitzmaurice Assembly.

Father Frundt started as Chaplain of the Delaware State Police in 1963, the same year he was asked by PGK Maurice Fitzharris to serve as Chaplain of Christopher Council. He was chaplain until 1967 when he was transferred from Holy Rosary Church. In 1999 he returned as chaplain to Christopher Council when asked by PGK Dennis Harris and continued in that capacity providing members with his friendship and spiritual guidance until his death. Father Frundt has faithfully served his Delaware State Police and Knights of Columbus families for years.

You will be truly missed. Rest in peace, Father.

Knights of Columbus 133rd Supreme Convention Philadelphia, Pennsylvania August 4-6, 2015

Plans have been finalized by Pennsylvania State Council for hosting the 133rd International Supreme Convention in the City of Brotherly Love in August. With its close proximity to Delaware, we Delaware Knights will have an opportunity to view first hand in the beautiful liturgies each morning and attend the business sessions.

On Tuesday afternoon, August 4, the States Dinner will be held at the Pennsylvania Convention Center. During dinner the song of each jurisdiction of the United States, Canada and other countries will be sung by their respective delegations. This is a first-class formal dinner that you will not want to miss.

Opening Mass on August 4 is normally celebrated with 12-15 Cardinals, 75 Bishops and 300 priests and deacons. With the central geographical location of Philadelphia, the participation this year is expected to be much higher.

On Tuesday morning the business sessions will begin with the report of Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson. This session will be an open meeting with spouses and family members able to attend. The business session on Wednesday will concentrate on the nominations and elections of Supreme Directors to fill vacancies on the board. On Wednesday afternoon there is usually a Marian devotion followed by an Awards Ceremony. Jurisdictions are recognized for winning programs and this event will be open to family members as well. Finally, the business session on Thursday morning will address the many resolutions submitted by delegations around the world.

There will be a Mass each morning of the convention. The opening Mass is Tuesday at 9:30 a.m. The Mass on Wednesday and the Memorial Mass on Thursday is at 8:00 a.m. In past years the choir from the Basilica in Washington, D.C. was on hand for the musical liturgy.

The Philadelphia Downtown Marriot is the convention headquarters, but all rooms (\$175 plus tax) must be booked online through the Supreme Secretary's office. Parking has a daily rate of \$43.

I am not certain which events, if any, most Knights will want to attend. The States Dinner comes highly recommended. The cost of the States Dinner is \$60 per person and tickets must be reserved online from Supreme Council. The dinner is formal attire only with ladies in gowns and Knights in white dinner jackets. If there is enough interest, the council will arrange for bus transportation to and from the dinner that evening. Let the Grand Knight know if you want to participate.

K of C LICENSE PLATES

Delaware Knights of Columbus license plates are available to any brother Knight in good standing. There are

two ways to select a number. You can either call the chairman or do it on-line. Check the list, select a number then call the chairman. The chairman will send the member an approved



request. The approved request is completed by the member and sent to the Department Motor Vehicle (DMV) with nominal one time charge of \$10.

When you get a KC tag you keep your present tag. The old tag must be kept in the vehicle at all times and display of either or both tags is legal. The KC tag can be put on a truck up to3/4 ton capacity.

When you pay the \$10 fee and get a new KC plate, it will include a second expiration sticker for the KofC plate. It takes about 6 weeks to get a new tag from DMV.

When your registration expires and you go to re-register the vehicle the DMV will give you two expiration stickers. When you transfer your tags to a new vehicle the KC tag transfers at no cost. The name of the brother Knight to whom the plate is issued must be on the vehicle registration (vehicle may be co-registered with a nonknight such as a spouse).

If a member dies the tag must be returned to the DMV. Tags are not transferable and they must be returned to DMV.
