
# PRAYERS FOR SOULS IN PURGATORY!

November is traditionally an important month to pray for those in purgatory. Many of us will visit the graves of the departed on All Souls' Day, November 2<sup>nd</sup>.



While confession is essential for the forgiveness of sins, purgatory may still be necessary for many of us to satisfy the temporal punishment still due for venial and forgiven mortal sins.

In purgatory, the souls of many of those who have died in God's grace undergo purification so that they may enter heaven.



The Prayer of St. Gertrude is one of the most famous of the prayers for souls in purgatory. St. Gertrude the Great was a Benedictine nun and mystic who lived in the 13th century. According to tradition, our Lord promised her that 1000 souls would be released from purgatory each time it is said devoutly.

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.

The church has endorsed the doctrine of purgatory right up through Vatican II in the 1960's. Many of the Fathers of the Church, such as St. Augustine and St. John Chrysostom, considered prayers for souls in purgatory to be essential.



### Our Lady Queen of Peace Assembly 3038, Smyrna

In celebration of their fifth anniversary, Our Lady Queen of Peace Assembly took Delaware's first Columbian Squires circle to Washington, D.C., to teach them that "Freedom Is Never Free" and to educate them on the importance and true meaning of patriotism. Visiting all major national memorials by their progressive order in our nation's history, the Squires and Assembly made stops at the Washington Monument and the World War II, Korean and Vietnam Memorials. Seeing such chilling monuments as the wall of stars, representing 405,399 lives, at the World War II Memorial really brought home the realization of how many heroic men and women sacrificed their lives for our country's freedom. This was one of two trips planned by the assembly. Next year's trip will be to Arlington, Virginia, for a tour of the National Cemetery and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, to continue honoring our fallen veterans.

The announcement was made recently at the Award's session of the Supreme Convention in Orlando, FL. Our congratulations to Our Lady Queen of Peace Assembly 3038 in Smyrna, Delaware for receiving this award for their "Freedom is Not Free" project.
