As you well know, fall is quickly approaching and with it a new football season. And, of course, with that comes the Delaware Knights of Columbus, Annual Catholic Schools Scholarship Fund 10-week Football Fund Crazr.


This fundraiser benefits the Catholic Elementary Schools of the State of Delaware. Each \$10 ticket sold gives the participant a chance of seven weekly prizes. All the details are spelled out on each ticket. The weekly drawings run from Nov 1 to Jan 3 (last 10 weeks of the football season). Members can pick up tickets from the Grand Knight at the meeting. It would be great to have tickets returned by the council business meeting in October. The first drawing will be November 1.

Delaware State Council provides the individual councils

with the tickets and will distribute all the prizes to those with winning entries. Weekly results can be viewed by all at www.fundcrazr.com.

Your football ticket will have 3 teams assigned to it for each of the ten weeks. Your 3 teams will change each week. "Highest" and "lowest" points across all entries win a prize each week (highest -\$150, 2nd highest - \$80, 3rd highest - \$60, 4th highest - \$40, 5th highest - \$30, lowest - \$30, 2nd - lowest \$10). You don't have to do a thing except buy the ticket.

Our goal this year is to increase the amount of scholarships given to schools. Tuitions continue to rise and we can be of assistance to a family who needs a few more dollars to give their child a Catholic Education. Only with your support we will achieve our goal.

Mid-Year State Council Meeting Planned for January, 2016

With the revision of bylaws ratified by delegates to the annual State Convention in May, and subsequent approval by Supreme Council in August, Article III, Section 2. provides for Delaware State Council to conduct a mid-year meeting in addition to the State Convention scheduled for May 13-15 at the Princess Royale in Ocean City, Maryland. The exact time and place along with agenda for this meeting will be announced in the near future.

At this mid-year meeting a financial reporting of the 2014 -15 Columbian Year will be presented and it will be an ideal time to review and discuss organizational issues and our many state programs. Official business such as amendments to the bylaws, election of officers, resolutions, per capita assessments, etc. shall be only conducted at the regular Annual Meeting of State Council in May.

Election of Delegates and Alternates to Mid-Year and Annual Meetings of Delaware State Council will be held at business meeting on Oct. 6, 2015

In order for Christopher Council to have representation at these meeting, the first order of business under "new business" at our October business meeting on October 6, 2015 will be the election of delegates and alternates to represent the council. The Grand Knight by virtue of his office is automatically a delegate. In future years the election of delegates will be held in conjunction with the election of officers in June of each year.



Support Persecuted Christians in the Middle East

Dear Brother Knight,

The Knights of Columbus is committed to assisting our Christian brothers and sisters who are suffering in the Middle East. At this year's Supreme Convention, I announced a "Season of Truth" dedicated to raising awareness of their plight, and the plight of other religious minorities in the region.

The violence in the Middle East has led to many deaths and the greatest refugee crisis since WWII. Over four million people have been displaced. Among the most affected are Iraqi and Syrian Christians, who are the victims of ongoing systematic cleansing and persecution. While the Christian population in Iraq once numbered above a million, violence has reduced that number by more than 65%. This human catastrophe has drawn commentary from Pope Francis, who said this of the persecution:

Today we are dismayed to see how in the Middle East and elsewhere in the world many of our brothers and sisters are persecuted, tortured and killed for their faith in Jesus. In this third world war, waged piecemeal, ... a form of genocide is taking place.

As Knights of Columbus we cannot be part of what Pope Francis has called the "complicit silence" of many who hear of these atrocities and do nothing. We must act.

To date, we have donated more than \$4 million to relief efforts in Iraq and Syria through the Knights of Columbus Christian Refugee Relief Fund. We have also launched a website and released a commercial to raise awareness of the crisis. However, more assistance is needed, as the response from the international community has been woefully inadequate.

Please go to christiansatrisk.org to learn more about this humanitarian emergency and to make a donation that will provide material assistance to these refugees. Please also consider sharing this message with your family and friends.

As Knights of Columbus, we are called to stand in solidarity with all those Christians around the world who are suffering from violent persecution, offering spiritual and material assistance to these victims of crimes against humanity. Please pray daily for our Christian brothers and sisters - for their perseverance in faith and hope, the improvement of their living conditions, and the restoration of peace in their land.
