Chaplain's Reflection

Hell

In the Gospel of John, we read "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. (Jn 3:16)." Yet, in the Gospel of Mark, we hear Jesus say that "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire (Mk 9:43)." This raises the question: how could a God who is described as infinitely good; create, sustain, and send anyone to a place of infinite, horrible torment.

Yet, as uncomfortable as the idea that hell exists might be, it follows directly from two other doctrines central to our faith. Namely, that (first) God is love, and that (second) we human beings have free will.

First, that God is love. We do not simply believe that God has love, or that love is one of God's attributes, or that love is something that God does from time to time. Love is what God is. The whole nature, essence, substance, and life of God is love. To will only good things for his children. That is who God is. Therefore, God does not go in and out of love, does not love some and hate others. He does not go into emotional snits and change his mind. God simply is love. In Jesus' language, God is like the sun that shines on the good and the bad alike.

Second, that human beings have free will. God made the planets, and plants and animals, and insects to glorify him simply by being themselves. That's how they glorify the divine goodness. But, human beings he made with

intelligence and will. That means he wants us to respond to his intentional love; who he is, with our own intentional love. So, he gave us the privilege of our freedom.

Now, with freedom comes the possibility of abusing freedom. The nature of freedom allows us to say yes to the love that God is, and thereby find joy and peace, and our own deepest purpose. Or, we can say no and resist it.

What does resistance cause? Since God knows and intentionally wills only what is good for us, resistance will always cause suffering at the deepest level of the soul. It's like fire, it's like torment, it's like the everlasting flames of Biblical language used to describe great spiritual suffering. So what is hell? Hell would be that final and definitive no to God's love uttered from the very depth of one's soul. The rejection of the good things that God has intended for us. That's hell. Eternal suffering because it's this eternal no to the love that God is.

Now in light of this clarification, we can see how all of the language of God sending people to hell, God condemning people to hell because of their mistakes and so on, is problematic. **God does not send people to hell.** Rather, people send themselves into this state by their refusal of His divine love.

As C. S. Lewis said, "The door to hell is always locked from the inside." It is not as though God is maliciously locking it from the outside, locking people in. Rather, it's people themselves, who by their refusal, lock themselves away from the divine love. That's what hell would be.

Lewis also said, "The love of God lights up the fires of hell." So, what does that mean? You see love is what God is. That is all that God knows how to do. The love of God is always shining on us, but if you turn away from it, it becomes a kind of torture to you because your innermost soul wants to respond to it, and is empty without it. The very love in which the saint basks in joy, is what the unforgiven sinner suffers in.

Carhart Sends Another Woman to Hospital

On December 15, an ambulance transported a woman from LeRoy Carhart's Germantown clinic to a nearby hospital. Carhart – one of the few doctors in the country who perform third trimester abortions — opened his Germantown facility in December 2010. This is the ninth medical emergencies at this facility documented by Operation Rescue. In February 2013, Jennifer Morbelli, who was 33-weeks pregnant, died from complications arising from his abortion procedure. Physician-Assisted Suicide in Maryland

A bill to allow physician assisted suicide will be reintroduced this year in the Maryland General Assembly. Proponents will be pressing hard to pass it. Expected to be similar to the bill that was defeated last year, it probably would allow doctors to legally prescribe a lethal dose of drugs at the request of a patient who has been deemed mentally competent and who has received a terminal diagnosis. The legislation, referred to by its proponents as "death with dignity," is unnecessary, flawed, and lacks safeguards. You can stay informed by:

40 Days for Life Spring Campaign
