Chaplain's Reflection

The Wedding Feast at Cana

The story of the wedding feast at Cana is surely one of the most charming in the Bible. But what does it mean? Perhaps the most obvious meaning is that Jesus by his attendance at the feast endorsed human sexual love.

Marriage--a man and a woman committing themselves to each other for life--holds the greatest possibility for human happiness that any human relationship can offer. However, a marriage will only be as alive as the people in it.

And, what happened at the wedding feast at Cana happens sooner or later in every marriage, namely, the wine runs out. What do we mean by this?

Hardly any human event creates such high expectations as marriage. The typical marriage starts off with a feast of joy like the wedding feast in today's gospel. You are full of hopes and dreams. The wine is flowing freely, and you have the euphoric feeling of romantic love, a love that will never end.

But then, you must begin the hard work of setting up a home and learning to live with each other. You will find great joy in each other's company. You will be convinced that your love was pre-ordained in heaven and meant to last for eternity. During this "honeymoon" period, it looks as if your expectations are going to be fulfilled. The wine is still flowing.

But when human beings are close to one another problems inevitably occur. As you get to know each other, you will discover that you did not marry an angel after all, but an imperfect human being, with the same needs and failings as everyone else. Sooner or later, the wine will run out, just as at Cana.

Romantic love is not an aberration. It is a powerful taste of the divine. But the first wine of "romantic" love must inevitably run out so that the best wine of a new and deeper love can be born.

Marriages last, relationships last, when we learn how to nurture each other and to nurture ourselves by carrying each other's love, not our grudges. We look for the good and we praise that good in each other. We do not leave each other, because love becomes the glue that binds us together across any space between us, even across time.

We discover the love of God in our lives, so we learn to love and live like God, and we learn to love each other. We care about each other instead of being cruel to each other. We show our appreciation for what is, not our complaints about what is not.

We need to make our marriage partner our ally, not our adversary. Marriages are better when the husband and wife clearly understand that they are on the same side. It really is almost always true that the person we first set our heart on is actually the right person for us. The grass will never be greener somewhere else.

Love is not easy because life is not easy. Like our lives, our love will always be imperfect. But deepened love transcends feelings. Deepened love is typified by Mary's attitude at Cana — 'they have no wine.'
