Chaplain's Reflection

Loving Ourselves

St. Paul tells us "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Gal 5:14) But, believe it or not, we cannot love our neighbor as Christ would unless, we first love ourselves. Our greatest enemy is often the enemy within. Perhaps we have been taught to love others but not to love ourselves.

First, we must respect the creation of God that we are! We must believe that we are made in the image of God. We must see ourselves and our worth in relation to God. Yet, we experience a great resistance to self-love.

Some of this may be rooted in a poor understanding of just how much God loves and esteems us. Psalm 8 (6-7) tells us that God made man little less than a god, crowned him with glory and honor, and gave him rule over the works of his hands. Yet, how many times have we been encouraged to believe that we give glory to God by thinking less of ourselves, or that life after death is the only life that matters. Such a beliefs can only lead to a feeling that we are always prodigal children who can never be good enough.

Second, any negative conditioning we may have received early in life is likely to continue to weigh against our self-concept. We can become predisposed to believe that we are not lovable even when we are beloved by others who touch our lives later.

It is always easier to make people feel guilty than to make people feel good about themselves. We know we are not perfect, so whenever we are reminded of this, it reinforces any negative perceptions that we may have of ourselves.

Third, a distorted notion of God will inevitably lead to a distorted notion of ourselves. When we internalize the critical voices of others who judge us or put us down, we put the enemy within ourselves! This destructive tendency, may be manifested in any number of ways.

First, it may drive us to seek unattainable levels of perfection. We can even use the words of Jesus himself to put ourselves down, "Be perfect as your father is perfect." Meanwhile, we forget that Jesus did not tell us to wait until our neighbor was perfect before we loved him or her. So why would Jesus wait until we are perfect to love us?

Second, we refuse to forgive ourselves. We may be carrying around in our minds things which God has long ago forgiven and forgotten. Regardless of any unfixable consequences of our sins, God still forgives them. Our continued remorse is part of our temporal punishment due to sin, not a sign from God that our sins are not forgiven.

Third, we may act out our lack of self-worth in ways that would seem to prove our worthlessness. Even people who seemingly have everything will invariably make destructive life choices if they think little of themselves.

The cure lies in reworking our self-imaging and self-perception. We need to pay attention to our mental diet! If one thought has the power to depress me, then there must be a better thought with the power to pick me up!
