Miracle of Christmas

Christmas is God's greatest miracle. What is a miracle? A miracle is any special showing of God's goodness. And His Son, the infant Jesus started working miracles right from the moment he was born. The streams would chatter, the trees would whoosh, the rains would pelt, and the grasses would rustle. And graciously, they blended his unmusical noises right into their symphony. Ezekiel came to understand how God had answered his prayers in a very special way, for he could talk with all the tongueless ones. His life became filled with joy.

However, one terrible morning, the innkeeper was really mean to him and sent him out to eat with the pigs in the stable behind the inn. Later that evening, large crowds suddenly descended upon Bethlehem, and the inn became very full. So, Ezekiel had to work long and late hours.
