# Chaplain's Reflection

# The Kingdom of Heaven

Jesus describes the Kingdom of Heaven as being like a treasure or fine pearls that would require us to sell everything that we have in order to purchase it. Thus, to attain the Kingdom of Heaven, we must completely dedicate our lives and our possessions to its acquisition, and surrender all of our worldly goods in the process.

Yet, as great as the promise of Heaven may be, and it is a promise, it still requires a great leap of faith to sacrifice the many worldly allurements that we can see, for something so much greater that we cannot see. We need look no further than the Apostle Thomas, to see it is easier to believe what we can see. Although, ironically, most of us can readily profess to loving the God that we cannot see, while we feel less loving towards the neighbor that we do see.

So the price of the Kingdom of God is such that we need to have complete faith in God expressed through our love of God and neighbor. There is nothing wrong with the goods of the world. In fact, God wants us to enjoy them and to use them and to do good with them. Recall, the disappointment of the master who gave talents to his three servants, and found that one had simply buried it (cf Mt 25:14-30).

Even though we cannot physically see God, God shows his face to every one of the seven billion people who live on this planet every day. But to



recognize God, we must have the lens of faith. That lens might be very well developed, or perhaps barely there. But, if we are open to the possibility of a good and gracious God who knows our needs better than we do, we will be able to see his activity in even the most mundane events of everyday life.
