Brothers, we are into Christmas Tree Sales at St. Mary again this year. This is a great opportunity to get involved in our largest fundraiser of the year and you will get to know your brother knights better while working shifts together. Tree sales started the first Saturday after Thanksgiving (**Nov. 27**th) when we took delivery of the trees from Mt. Rogers Tree Farm. We set up the tree stands, lights, and work tent one week prior on Saturday **Nov. 20**th (9:00 a.m.) We are selling trees **Wednesday through Sunday.** Sales will continue through Thursday **Dec. 23**rd when we will break down the sales site.

First up, we **NEED A DAY CAPTAIN FOR SATURDAY**. We utilize Day Captains to help with the daily operations of the Tree Sales including opening (3:00 p.m. on weekdays, and 8:00 a.m. on weekends) and closing (8:00 pm). Each captain also recruits Knights for shifts and bring rosters to the sight for each Knight to sign in. Due to some of our captains leaving the council or not able to do it anymore, we need some of you to step up this year and volunteer.

We want a minimum of 2 Knights per shift, so no one has to work by themselves. We **NEED VOLUNTEERS FOR SUNDAY.** This is only a 4-weekend event, and we need all-hands-on-deck for filling up sales shifts as early as possible.
