Christmas Trees Fundraiser



Brothers, we are starting preparation for Christmas Tree Sales at St. Mary again this year. This is a great opportunity to get involved in our largest fundraiser of the year and you will get to know your brother knights better while working shifts together. We will be setting up the on-line sign-up form soon and will send out the link when it's available. Tree sales start the first Saturday after Thanksgiving (**Nov. 27th**) when we take delivery of the trees from Mt. Rogers Tree Farm. We set up the tree stands, lights, and work tent one week prior on Saturday **Nov. 20th (9:00 a.m.)** We are going to sell trees **Wednesday through Sunday**. Sales will continue through Thursday **Dec. 23rd** when we will break down the sales site.

First up, we identify **Day Captains**. We utilize Day Captains to help with the daily operations of the Tree Sales including opening (3:00 p.m. on weekdays, and 8:00 a.m. on weekends) and closing (8:00 pm). Each captain also recruits Knights for shifts and bring rosters to the sight for each Knight to sign in. Due to some of our captains leaving the council or not able to do it anymore, we need some of you to step up this year and volunteer. **We need 3 new Day Captains this year.** One for Thursday, one for Saturday and one for Sunday. Please contact Tim Fleming as soon as possible if you can assist.

We want a minimum of 2 Knights per shift, so no one has to work by themselves. This is only a 4-weekend event, and we need all-hands-on-deck for filling up sales shifts as early as possible.
