Dear Brother Knights:

During the month of January, three regional Mid Term Grand Knight meetings were held, and, during the Membership portion of that meeting, I indicated that I would give you a one-year update as it relates to On Line Membership. I am pleased to provide that status report.

On Line Membership went live in New Jersey on February 5, 2018. Going live in New Jersey was the second wave of piloting this program in the Order and I can recall that it was met with skepticism at the January, 2018 Mid Term Grand Knight meetings. There were concerns related to the vetting of these new members, their status at a council meeting, the administration of the Admission Degree, etc... During this past year, the program has truly been an organic process with some changes made throughout the year but, I am pleased to report, that On Line Membership has been, and continues to be very successful.

At the one year mark, 229 men have joined the Order through the On Line Membership process and, when filling out the application, 137, or 60%, indicated either a specific council that they were interested in joining or the parish at which they are a member. In a year where membership is in a slump, this has been a bright light in the membership realm.

As I stated, the process has been organic, and changes have taken place and continue to evolve as we solidify this process. For example, the question came up how we handle a priest who joins the order via the on line process. Supreme has offered on line membership to all seminarians at no cost by entering the code SEM18. By the time you receive this newsletter, the State Deputy will share with the District Deputies new talking points that will be shared with the Grand Knights and the council Membership Chairman for addressing new on line members. The State Membership Team will also be working with the local councils to develop Landing Pages that were discussed at the Mid Term meetings. As we prepare for the Spring Membership Drives, please use all these tools to assist you in bringing new men into our Order

You have heard me say it before and, I say it again – Nothing Changes if Nothing Changes! The success in turning these on line members into degree members of local councils has been a joint effort of the Membership Team and the Fraternal Benefits Team, headed up by our General Agents.

These are exciting times and the State Membership Team will be with you every step of the way to assist you. If you need our help, please feel free to contact us.

SHOULDER TO SHOULDER YOUTH PROTECTION PROGRAM

The Knights of Columbus, locally, statewide and nationally, are committed to openly supporting law enforcement, our brothers and sisters in blue. The purpose of this program is to actively demonstrate our commitment to these fine people.

Through the Shoulder to Shoulder Program, we hope to raise awareness of the job they perform each day, often without fanfare. We also hope to raise funds through the sale of magnetic bumper stickers, banners and rubber bracelets. The funds raised through this program will be donated to families of officers slain in the line of duty statewide. We also plan to use some of the proceeds to establish and promote public service announcements promoting and supporting law enforcement.

The public relations aspect of this program is of primary importance. We are committed to our mission and determined to utilize the media to its fullest extent to carry our message forward. The program would also be the vehicle to promote those positive stories of community service that highlight the good works that most police officers perform every day, but usually never make it to the news outlets. The program committee is seeking the services of Brother Knights who have experience in media and its related fields to brainstorm and develop ways to implement this objective. Those who have contacts in the media and are willing to share them are encouraged to contact us.

The State Chairman of the program is a retired Brick Township Police Officer, Anthony Barlowski, FDD. Tony was asked to become chairman of the program because as a retired police officer, it was felt he would have a better vision of how and where this program would better serve the law enforcement community.

SHOULDER TO SHOULDER is a work in progress. As it continues to expand through the distribution of magnets, the intention is to support all members of law enforcement; especially those killed in action and their families in as many ways as our collective imaginations allow. A Resolution of Condolences is being designed that will respectfully convey our support and sympathy to the survivors of our fallen heroes. The Program intends to reach out to all of the victims of this war on law enforcement to let them know we are there for them. Hopefully, through the continued support and generosity of our brother Knights and the public, we will be positioned to provide moral and financial support to the survivors of those New Jersey officers who are killed in action.

Recognizing that children are a precious gift, the Knights of Columbus has no higher priority than the safety and well-being of the young people served through its programs and activities.

The Knights of Columbus Safe Environment Program is designed to protect young people served through Knights of Columbus programs and activities, including the Columbian Squires Program, from all forms of abuse. The program helps assure families, dioceses and communities that the Knights of Columbus has done everything within its power to safeguard the young people served through its programs and activities.

The Knights of Columbus Safe Environment Program is administered by the Fraternal Services Department of the Knights of Columbus in partnership with Praesidium, an organization that has worked to provide knowledge and tools that safeguard against sexual predators for

more than 20 years, and is an international leader in youth protection. Through this partnership, the Order provides youth leaders with access to the most current resources to keep children safe, including Praesidium's Armatus® online training, background screenings, and



an exclusive hotline to report child safety concerns (1-844–KOFC–SAFE (844–563–2723)). All materials are available in English, Spanish and French to make the content accessible to all members who will be asked to fulfill organizational requirements. Please note that the Praesidium Armatus online platform is an English site, but each training course is available in both French and Spanish.

Knights of Columbus Office of Youth Protection Program requirements are independent of all of the safe environment/youth protection requirements established by local dioceses and parishes.




