Fellow Knights: During the month of October we had 8 donations! That's 2 months in a row with that many. Way to finish up Fall and start the Winter! Thank you to those who are able to help with this gift of life.

LifeStream assists about 80 medical facilities in the local Southern California area, serving approximately 3.2 million people. Aside from their technical and clerical staff, there are also vital volunteer positions, filled with people who are an essential part of the 'life-giving' team. The "Heart at Work" program provides 1) a way to get involved in the community, 2) opportunities to develop new skills, 3) contacts to make new friends, and 4) self-satisfaction through making a difference in the lives of others. These volunteers support the operations by creating a pleasant, educational, and comforting experience for donors.








Culture of Life____

In view of this, we cannot disregard what Islamic forces are doing to Christians and other non-Muslim persons in the middle east who will not convert to Islam. We must be pro-active in meeting such a threat here in America. Also, remember to be pro-active in the signing of petitions which will promote Personhood for the Unborn Child, as well as petitions to de-fund Planned Parenthood (PP). Can you believe that the state of California is now requiring pro-life crisis pregnancy centers, like ours in San Bernardino, to promote abortion services to the women who turn to them for help in their moment of crisis. This outrageous law, which is an assault on the First Amendment Freedom Of Speech, requires the crisis center to post a sign informing every woman who passes through its doors that the State of California will pay for them to have an abortion by just calling a toll-free no., and, course that number will lead them to PP, or a similar abortion group. Crisis pregnancy centers who fail to comply will face crippling fines. What audacity! The American Center For Law & Justice (ACLJ), who our council supports, financially, has filed a major lawsuit against the law. ACLJ could use financial help. If you can and want to, please call me (909) 862-6662 for info concerning how to do it. All of us, certainly, must be pro-active in anything we can do to reverse this law. Let us also remember to pray about any of these actions we take.
