My civilian education continued as a graduate of St Mary's University (CUM LAUD) in 1952 with a commission in the regular army. In 1967 I completed my civilian education upon graduation from the University of Oklahoma with an MS degree. My military education culminated upon graduation from the National War College in 1973. On active duty I served in Korea (Combat), Germany (with family), Vietnam (Combat), and numerous locations in the United States with Family. After serving 30 years on active duty, I retired in 1982 with rank as Colonel.

My wife and I have been married almost 67 years and raised 7 very successful children, the oldest of which is planning to retire from Lockheed within a year. Hospital administration, State department, church volunteer, elementary education, computer engineering, and a commission in the USAF serving as a medical doctor are other careers of our children's employment. We are blessed with 12 grand children. Two are married and we anticipate four more weddings in 2021.

Upon retirement from active duty, I worked for 15 years in banking. Later, in 1997 I retired from the work force and began volunteering at St. Mark the Evangelist.

I joined the Knights of Columbus in 1985, serving as the Grand Knight of Council 7613, District Deputy, and Diocesan Deputy of our Archdiocese. During this time Beverly and I organized our parishioners, received MSGR Ryan's blessing and inaugurated the ministry known as "Habitat for Humanity". Our parishioners built 19 houses and later were blessed when SK Bill and Kathy Faucher assumed leadership.

In 2008 I was asked by Chris Lewis to coordinate the fund raising activity for the American Wheel Chair Mission for the Knights of Columbus throughout Texas. I led this mission for 10 years. PGK/SK Jon Klauenberg has recently volunteered to assume leadership of the

Wheel Chair Mission. I plan to continue to be helpful to others when my health permits.

GET TO KNOW YOUR BROTHER KNIGHTS BETTER EUGENE (GENE) TUPACZ

Was born January 17, 1943 and lived in USMA West Point quarters until joining the Air Force in July 1965. My father was stationed at West Point from 1936 to 1966 as a musician in the USMA band and retiring a Sergeant Major.

I received a BS degree in Accounting with history and education minor from the State U. of New York at Albany in June 1964. First job upon graduation was teaching Bookkeeping and Business Math at Clarkstown Senior High School, New City, NY. I, as a student, taught there and was hired full time. Really enjoyed that one year of teaching but left to fly airplanes and travel in the Air Force. Obtained a Masters in Education Administration degree Dec 1972 at Our Lady of the Lake U.

First assignment after getting AF wings, was piloting AC47 gunships, Puff the Magic Dragon or Spooky at Bien Hoa Air Base, Viet Nam (III Corps) from Feb 1967 to Feb 1968. Next assignment was to Norton AF Base, San Bernardino flying mostly the Pacific in C141 transports.

I was in and out of Viet Nam twice a month for next 3 years. My final AF assignment was as a Flight Commander (instructor) at Air Force Officer Training School, Medina Base, San Antonio. I left AF after 8 years of active duty in July 1973.

I married Peggy Lehn on December 20, 1974, and have 3 grown children and one granddaughter. In various San Antonio Parishes, I taught high School CCD for over a decade, was a lector for 14 years, and school board member for 3 years at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Selma, Texas. I attended the first San Antonio ACTS Retreat in Aug 1987 and was a team member for next 2 retreats.

<u>Civilian jobs post Air Force</u>: Served as development Officer at Trinity U., July 1973 to July 1975; Vice President of University

Relations Our Lady of the Lake U. from July 1975 to Feb 1978; and was Vice President at Frost Bank from Feb 1978 to Feb 1981.

I was the Senior Vice President at Gill Savings from Feb 1981 to Oct 1982; and was a Financial Advisor/Stock Broker starting with EF Hutton in Nov 1982, then other firms until retirement in Sep 2018.

In Feb 1984, I joined the Navy Reserve as a Lt Commander in Naval Intelligence. Retired from Navy with 20 years of combined service as a Navy Captain (O-6) in Apr 1996.

I joined the K of C in St John Neumann Parish in Aug 2003 and am a Third Degree Knight. I joined St Marks Parish in Jun 2019, and the Knights of Columbus Council 7613 in Aug 2019.

<u>Awards and Achievements</u>: In the military, I was awarded 2 Distinguished Flying Crosses, 10 Air Medals, an Air Force Commendation Medal, 2 Vietnamese Crosses of Gallantry, and an Air Force and Navy Expert Marksman. While employed at Our Lady of the Lake, I was selected as one of the Outstanding Young Men in America.

My Hobbies pertain to military and political history, classical music, chess, and pistol shooting.




