There are about 4 weeks to prepare for this coming, this remembrance. We all know that Jesus came some 2000 years ago. He came to be among us. However, doesn't Jesus come to us more often? Jesus comes to us in a very special way each time we receive Holy Communion. Jesus is truly present under the appearances of bread and wine. Do you believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist? The Real Presence is at the center of our faith. Pro-Life Notes-A Need for Prayer

If you don't believe in prayer, just look at what is happening on the pro-life scene. Here are some of the examples of what prayer can do:

- 1) The Green Bay Packers Foundation has not awarded grants to Planned Parenthood nor any organizations that support the taking of innocent life since Restore Packer Pride started praying and making noise.
- 2) "Court again lets Texas abortion ban continue, rejecting Biden Appeal," a recent headline, a victory for Pro-Life..
- 3) As this is being written, the U. S. Supreme Court is hearing oral arguments in the Mississippi lawsuit that places restrictions on abortions and has the possible net effect of striking down Roe v. Wade. Pray that the conservative court will render a just decision.
- 4) Just last month a law that adds information about Wisconsin Safe Haven Laws into school sexual education curriculum was signed into Law by Governor Evers. Safe Haven Laws in WI. allow newborn infants less than 72 hours old to be "dropped off" in the care of police officers, first responders, and hospital workers without legal consequences. Once a child is relinquished, an adoption can be facilitated.
- 5) The latest fall session of 40 Days for Life has saved countless preborns from being aborted.
