Thanksgiving Food Basket Project Completed

On Saturday morning Nov. 17th nine Council 15126 Knights volunteered their service to help pick up, transfer, sort, repackage and deliver family sized boxes of food to help make a better Thanksgiving holiday meal for 40 needy but deserving families. Council Thanksgiving Food Basket event chair was Ray Heitman who coordinated the contents of food to purchase for each box. The food was actually distributed through the Catholic Charities family assistance program. The food was transported from Ray's Green Hills to the St Joseph Catholic **Charities Agency offices on South** 10th Street. Thanks go to Mike Violett, Mark Werner and Ray Heitman for the use of their pickup trucks which made quick work of the food transporting, sorting and repackaging. Individual council member Knights stepped up to cover all of the purchase costs of a \$25 donation for each box of

food. A total of 1,800 pounds of food was donated through this Faith In Action council project this year which duplicates our donation of one year ago. This food donation will be applied toward our Council's total annual participation in the Missouri State Council's Food For Families Program. Each 1000 pounds of food donated through this state program nets a \$100 rebate to the Council's general fund. Any summer produce donated to the SFX House of Bread and the "40 Cans for 40 Days" individual Lenten non-perishable food donations will also be added to make our total food program goals. Council 15126 has been recognized by the state council for the past four years for meeting the 1000 pound minimum for donated food. Remember those 40 families who benefitted from our Council charity when the 40 days of Lent arrive this year.
