Chaplain's Reflection Incarnation

In her Magnificat prayer, Mary reflects on the Incarnation of God in the Christ child she was carrying within her womb. "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my Spirit rejoices in God, my Savior."

Belief in the Incarnation is what makes Christianity profoundly different from all other religions. For Muslims, although Allah is merciful, he is too holy to have a personal relationship with man. Our Jewish ancestors expected God to intervene in their history through the heroic actions of a holy man. They never imagined God himself would enter into human history as one of us. But why did God became man? Many believe, as proposed by St. Anselm of Canterbury (1033-1109) and further reflected on by St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274), that God sent Jesus primarily to atone for the original sin of our first parents, Adam and Eve, through His suffering and death on the cross. And certainly, Jesus redeemed us.

However, there is another tradition within Christianity going back much earlier, to the Fathers of the Church and later most clearly expressed in Franciscan spirituality, especially in the writings of Blessed John Duns Scotus (1265–1308). It proposes that God loves us so much that from the very beginning of creation, it was always God's plan to enter human history as one of us. In other words, even though God did send His Son to redeem us, He would have entered our world anyway even if Adam had not sinned.

God became human simply because God is Infinite Love. And God's Love is free and infinitely greater than any sin. Sin has a no power or influence over God. So Adam's sin would neither force God nor cause God to become incarnate simply to atone for the effects of our sins.

For God to allow any human disobedience or sin to force His hand would be a denial of God's freedom and dignity.

Christmas is about the physical birth of Love, Jesus Christ, among us. Simply put, Christmas is a feast about Love and Love's decision to become part of the universe by becoming flesh.

We can more easily appreciate how much God loves

We kicked off the Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest and offered our parishes a chance to participate. We hosted the SJE Teen Group as it did prayers in the St John's Cemetery for All Souls Day. Rain did not stop this group from having a bonfire on Council grounds and toasting s'mores.

Deputy Grand Knight Gusman delivered about 40 gently used men's winter coats that members of the Council donated to the Home Builders Care Assessment Center, a men's shelter in Rockville.

As always, we remembered those Knights who passed away this past year with a Memorial Mass. Fr. Calis led a beautiful Mass and it was highlighted by what some are calling the New Rosensteel Chorus. Many families of our departed Knights were there to give honor and pray for their souls. The Mass was followed with a dinner and the frozen turkey raffle. One of the annual winners was there to claim his turkey (next year we'll just give a frozen turkey to Joe Sparacino and save time).

Tim Sullivan, Tim Stocker and many volunteers prepared needy food baskets for distribution to local organizations and parishes that identified families in need of a meal for
