FOOD DRIVES

As per the request of Bishop Christopher Coyne, he is asking all Councils in the jurisdiction of Vermont to hold at least one food drive for the various food pantries throughout the State of Vermont. There are many, many families that need our help and this is in line with Supremes request to: Leave No Neighbor Behind due to the COVID pandemic.

DECEASED MEMBERS

Our State Treasurer, Chis Poirier has asked that when a member of your Council has died to please send the information to me, your State Deputy. Our State Secretary, Jim Michael will then send a sympathy card to the family of the deceased. We will also be sending a Mass Card to the family. Again, please send the pertinent information to me so we can let the widows of our deceased member know that we are thinking of them in their time of sorrow and grief.

ULTRASOUND UPDATE

As of this writing, we currently have raised \$47,562.31 towards our goal of \$50,000.00. We still need \$2,437.69 to reach that goal. Fr. Naples (State Chaplain) and I have been in touch with Deb Couture, Executive Director of Aspire Together and Deb let us know that Save the Storks foundation has awarded Aspire Together a grant for \$50,000.00 and Supreme will be paying the entire amount for an ultrasound machine fitted for a mobile ultrasound unit. We also have given Charlebois, Inc. a deposit of \$25,000.00 to hold the van for us. Words of thanks and gratitude do not come close to how grateful I am as your State Deputy seeing this project become a reality. YOU will be helping to save the lives of so many babies in the State of Vermont. THANK YOU ALL again.

SUPREME UPDATE

Last week end (November 19-21), I attended the Mid-Year Meeting for all State Deputies and it was extremely informative and there are quite a few news things coming from Supreme that are expected to be in place by the first of the new year of 2021. I will not go into detail for each and every one of these items, but I will give you a brief synopsis of what is going to change. One of the first things that will begin right away is a State presence on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. Supreme instructed us that social media is the way of the future and not just social media, but our meetings and get togethers as Councils as well. I have asked Valdemar Garibay, Grand Knight of St. Albans Council to take on the task of our social media presence and he has agreed. Thank you Valdemar for stepping up to the plate and taking care of this. His mentor will be Frank Montero from Supreme who handles all social media for the Knights of Columbus out of New Haven, CT. When it comes to your Council meetings, Supreme has amended the Charter, Constitution and By-Laws, Section 124 (to be voted upon at next years Supreme Convention), that each Council will now have two meetings per month. The first meeting will be an "Officer's Planning" meeting and the second will be your regular Council meeting. Please note that this will now be a requirement from Supreme. The other change is for how Grand Knights run a meeting. The current folder has 29 elements to it and Supreme has changed that down to 15 elements. They are as follows: Call to Order; Opening Prayer; Pledge of Allegiance; Approve previous minutes; Chaplain message; Grand Knight report; Financial Report; Membership; Other reports (chairs); Unfinished business; New business; Good of the Order to include and awards, etc (Knight of the month, family of the month); Lecturer reflection (Into the Breach); Grand Knight summary; Closing Prayer; Adjourn. Supreme is also asking that the recorder or Grand Knight email (with security in place), the minutes of the previous meeting at least one week prior to your regular monthly meeting. Minutes do not have to be read at your regular Council meeting, but the previous minutes do need a motion, a second and a vote to approve. Supreme will have this new format available for all Grand Knights around the second week of December, so stay tuned for more information on this. Also, due to COVID restrictions, we need to do as many "virtual" sessions as we can until the Governor changes or removes the restrictions. All fraternal leaders will be invited to, and encouraged to attend, a webinar on December 17th at 8:00 PM – Council Operations: New Guidelines For Council Meetings. Please try and attend this webinar.

EXEMPLIFICATION

The State Council now has a recorded version of the new degree if you are in need of it. Our State Membership Director, Ed Nuttall took on the task of organizing this and our State Treasurer, Chris Poirier videotaped it and did all the editing as well. Please remember that each Council should be working on getting their own individual team in place for future exemplifications. Thank you Ed and Chris!

The Laws of the Knights of Columbus permit subordinate councils to submit to the State Council resolutions that pertain to issues affecting the entire Order. It is expected that all such resolutions will be submitted in good faith and in a spirit of charity, unity, and fraternity. As you prepare for the State convention, please bear in mind the principles and procedures set forth below.

The State Council resolutions process was established to enable subordinate councils to:

- Express gratitude or support for a person, a fraternal program, or a policy of the Order;
- 2. Amend the State By-Laws;
- 3. Amend the State Policies;
- Express an official position of the Knights of Columbus on matters relevant to the mission and identity of the Order; and
- 5. Offer proposals to enhance the Order's fraternal mission.

Subordinate Councils should not submit resolutions that: (1) concern monetary expenditures by the State Council, such as financial grants to organizations; (2) deal exclusively with matters of local significance that are relevant only to a subordinate council; (3) endorse, recognize, commend, or criticize other organizations; or (4) have been repeatedly rejected by delegates to the State convention in recent years.

Resolutions adopted by a Local Council for consideration by the State Council must be submitted to the VT State Advocate no later than March 15. Please submit these resolutions by email using the following email address: WNMG@AOL.COM

VOCATIONS

The RSVP (Refund Support Vocations Program) has been and is the primary program through which Knights of Columbus councils, assemblies and circles participate in an organized manner in supporting vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The Church, especially here in Vermont as we all know faces a crisis of vocations to the priesthood and religious life Promoting vocations to the priesthood and religious life is one of our highest priorities of the Knights of Columbus. Keep the faith alive by supporting our seminarians and postulants. As the strong right arm of the church, the Knights of Columbus are committed to providing moral, financial and spiritual support to future priests and religious at all stages of their formation.

We as Knights of Columbus stand in solidarity with our priests and religious. Through this program, council and parish families will raise funds to support seminarians in their area. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported. Though financial support is vitally important, it is not the only aspect of RSVP. Councils are also called to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success. Our Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) Scholarship money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, clerical clothing, emergency expenditures and other living expenses.

Steve Shover, SD and Ed Nuttall SMD held "Zoom Sessions" with Councils 2025 WRJ., 2628 Springfield, 2832 Windsor and 14351 Randolph.

The State Deputy emphasized implementation of "Into the Breach" program consisting of:

- A 12-episode video series that seeks to answer the question of *what it means to be a man* and *how to live as a man in today's world*. Each episode focuses on a different aspect of authentic Catholic masculinity and features interviews with well-known Catholic commentators, as well as the personal story of a man who has deeply experienced the episode's topic in his own life. Each episode runs approximately 12 minutes. It was recommended the videos be shown after "The Good of the Order" at a Council meeting.

Tom Hegna Don't Worry, Retire Happy Webinar

Brother Knights:

After being reminded of this webinar by District Deputy Richard Powell at our October 6 Council meeting, I <u>did</u> sign up for it. But at the same time thinking to myself "I'm already retired, and I think my wife and I are pretty well set up financially. I also think that we already have all the insurance we need."

Well, in hindsight I conclude that I was wrong about two of those statements.

The hour I spent with this webinar was broadly informative about retirement matters, it did prompt me to re-examine my wife's and my current retirement plan, it made me feel good about good choices we had made, it alerted me to specific gaps in our planning, and it encouraged me to schedule a conversation with a financial planner or an insurance advisor (such as, of course, our Council's field agent Dave Giuliani).

The spine of the talk was Tom Hegna's "7 Steps to Retirement Security," all of which are contained in detail in his book <u>Don't Worry, Retire Happy</u>. As for the "take aways" that come to mind as I type: "Your retirement strategy should provide for increasing income during retirement, guaranteed and tax free income." "What provisions have you made for Long Term Care?" "Don't leave your kids money, leave them insurance." "Relying on assets like your house or a pile of money does not amount to a successful retirement strategy."

Flipping through the pages of notes I took: At one point in the webinar, Tom Hegna pointed to three circles: Social Security, Pensions, Annuities. Three sources of guaranteed retirement income. Both my wife and I didn't begin to draw on Social Security until age 70, and we both have dedicated pensions. We both have life insurance policies (I vaguely remember payout amounts) and cost of funeral policies. But clearly this third source needs attention, even at this late date when my wife and I are each over a decade into retirement. Attention from someone, of course, who could look with us at our whole financial situation, including property.

Another broadly informative retirement matter I took notes on comes from two questions Tom Hegna asked: How much guaranteed lifetime income do you have? What key retirement risks have you taken off the table? As to the second question, he proceeded to list and discuss ten key retirement risks: longevity, deflation, market, withdrawal rate, sequence of returns, long term care, mortality, inflation, regulatory, and taxation. I still don't understand "sequence of returns risk," but the most significant retirement risk, he told his listeners, is the longevity risk, because it is a risk multiplier.

SO and in sum: this webinar was well worth the hour I spend listening and taking copious notes; I have to thank the Knights of Columbus for sponsoring it; and having listened to webinar should prompt Knights to make an appointment with their field agent.
