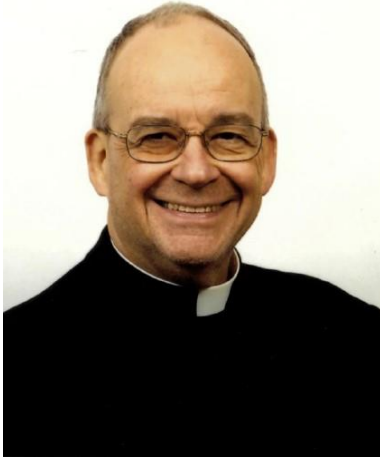

## A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN, REVEREND MARTIN VALLELY



Dear Brothers,

What a delight it is for me to share Advent and Christmas with you for the first time, and once again to thank you for the warmth and

kindness, the fraternity, respect, and support, with which you have welcomed me into your parish family and into this Council. I am especially glad to have had the opportunity to participate in the Degree Ceremonies which have brought us several brand new Members in these recent days.

I have come to you having lost my parents some years back now. As is probably true for most of us at this time of year, I find myself fondly remembering the experiences of the Christmases of my childhood. After Dad had set up the Christmas tree and strung its lights (often a frustrating experience!), it was Mum's turn to go to work. She carefully and lovingly put up each decoration and bauble on the tree, and also put up the tinsel with great precision, even strand by strand.....arranging and re-arranging, straightening and neatening, several times over (some of you will at this point be saying, "So that's where he got it from!") But I would never have had the patience to do what Mum did!!). The crowning glory was our Christmas Crib. We had one of those big old-fashioned radios, and the space it occupied

under one of our living room lamp tables was just perfect for the size of the crib. So every year, out would go the radio, and in would go the crib. Each figure was placed "just so". There were three angels, each in a robe of a different colour, and the one in white was always perched on top of the stable. The problem was that the stable had a somewhat sloped roof. The jiggling and jostling of busy children like me invariably caused the angel to slide off, several times each Christmas season. That angel suffered more than its share of chips, bangs, and bruises in the course of its years of heralding the Good News of Our Saviour's birth!! In the midst of a living room setting that had every item perfectly in place, that sliding angel fortunately, and happily, kept things in perspective.

In some ways, that little "fallen" angel is my most fond memory of all. I think it taught me early that nothing in this life is ever perfect. We, who try to live and proclaim Jesus Christ every day, are likewise not ever perfect. But we have a duty to keep trying to grow in our likeness to the Innocent One who was born that night. The little angel also taught me that life will be full of disappointments, frustrations, failures, falling down and getting up (or getting picked up) again and again and again.

The Son of God did not become incarnate, a human being, and dwell in our midst, in order to keep us down and at a distance from him. Precisely the opposite. He became one of us in order to pick us up. I always see his poverty in the stable as a sign of his loving identification with our spiritual

poverty. Our state can lead us readily to despair, but the Child Jesus is rather the bringer of hope. In his name, Knights of Columbus are to be bringers of hope, too. All your activities, at Christmas and at other times during the year, in outreach to the poor, and in support of innocent and vulnerable human life, are a particularly strong reminder of the hope which flows from the presence of God, dwelling in our midst. I thank you, again and again, for your generous commitment and witness to the gracious Christ Child of hope and joy, and pray that you will experience that joy in your own lives and family settings.

May Advent and Christmas be, for you and yours, a rich, joyful experience of peace, blessing, and hope.

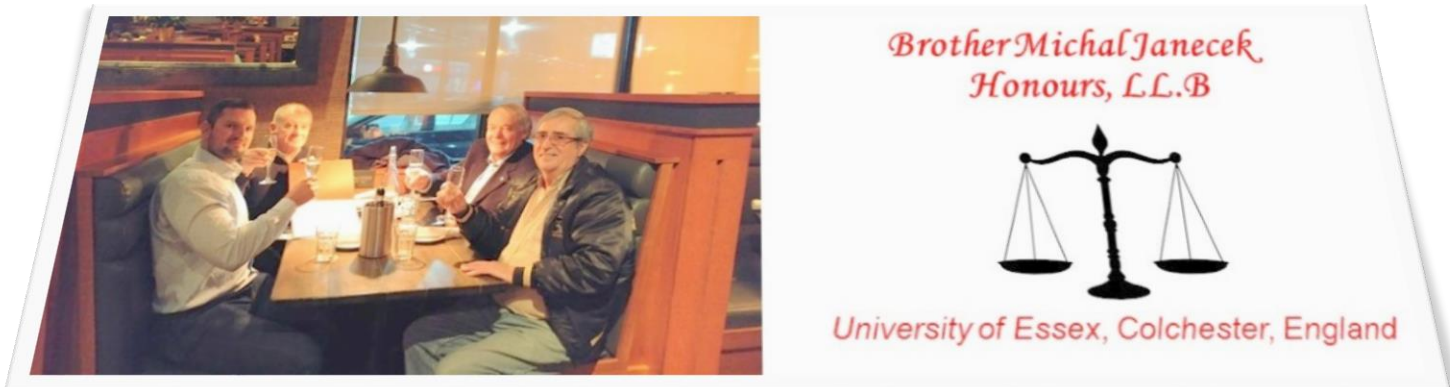

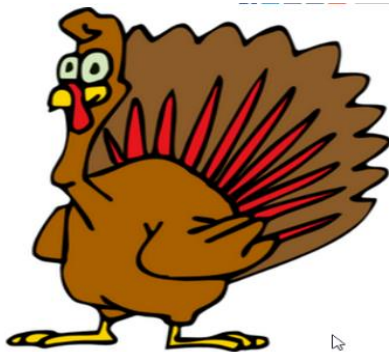

## CRIME STOPPERS PRESENTATION AT OUR NOVEMBER 1<sup>ST</sup> MEETING

Representatives of the Halton Region Crime Stoppers organization came to our November 1st meeting to provide us with some very interesting information about the purpose and many accomplishments of the crime stoppers movement.

Cal Miller (previously a reporter with the Toronto Star), Curt Allen (A member of Mary Mother of God K of C council in Oakville and a past Deputy Commissioner of the Royal Canadian Mounties) and Detective Paul Proto of the Halton Region police were on hand to speak to our council. Both Cal and Curt are volunteering their time to this worthy cause and as citizens of this community we should be grateful for their work. Detective Paul although he is compensated by Halton regional police, he is a one person team for the Crime Stoppers hotline. Paul pointed out many of the Crime Stoppers accomplishments in our own community to date including recovering over \$2.6 million worth of illegal drugs and having responded to over 1,000 anonymous tips. In the process, they have addressed issues including: human trafficking, bullying and animal cruelty to mention just a few of the areas of crime they help the police with.

The representatives pointed out how important it would be for the Knights of Columbus to throw their support to the Crime Stoppers movement, especially since the Knights have a great reputation with the general public. We can play an important role in helping the Crime Stoppers by making the population aware of the movement whenever we have an opportunity. We can also help them in their fund raising events and helping to create a youth ministry in our churches. The Crime Stoppers movement relies 100% on fund raising and donations to support their activities. They try to focus on youth so that younger people can be made fully aware of ways that they can help prevent crime and eliminate bullying.

Thank you Brother Joe Milton for arranging to have Crime Stoppers to come to our meeting.
