

Every year as Advent begins, we celebrate the Feast of the Apostle Saint Andrew. Saint Matthew's gospel tells us, "As Jesus was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers,

Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen.

He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.'" In immediately leaving their nets, they showed a great freedom. It was not that they were simply tired of fishing and looking for anything else to do.

Later, after the crucifixion of Jesus, we hear Peter say, "I am going fishing." They truly remained fisherman though their focus changed as disciples. Saint Andrew had first been a disciple of Saint John the Baptist. Saint John the Evangelist tells us that Andrew brought his brother Simon Peter to Jesus telling Peter, "We have found the Messiah." Saint Andrew listened to Jesus and then followed His example. Disciples discipline themselves in the way of their Master. In doing so, disciples of Jesus show forth the image of Christ and preach the Gospel.

During Advent, we remind ourselves to discipline ourselves toward a complete transformation to the lifestyle of Jesus Christ. As part of that transformation, we invite others to the special place that the Mass has in transforming us into the image of Christ.

Our plans for remodeling the restrooms were displayed and approved. We are working to get fixtures approved and then we can determine cost for a vote to remodel the restrooms.






## No Report For December

Seminarians Corner Nick Adam



Brother Knights,

As a part of my assignment at the seminary I have been asked to lead an Advent reflection at a local parish. As a part of the reflection I am focusing on the true meaning of Advent and its place in our liturgical calendar. I found this explanation from the US Bishops regarding the use of Advent wreaths. It's something so simple that we see every year, but I for one did not know exactly what the wreath meant until now:

"Traditionally, Advent wreaths are constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which four candles are inserted, representing the four weeks of Advent. Ideally, three candles are purple and one is rose, but white candles can also be used.

The purple candle in particular symbolizes the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas.

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead." *from USCCB.org*

Adoption not Abortion

#### "For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God" (Romans 13:1).

The results for the 40 Days for Life campaign are in: 872 LIVES WERE SAVED when their mothers chose LIFE. Eight abortion industry workers experienced conversions during this campaign and quit their jobs. Some of the employees who leave their abortion jobs greet 40 Days for Life vigil participants outside their workplaces with a common sentiment: "I just can't do this anymore!" Peaceful prayer witness outside their windows has made a difference.

Thank you all that took a few minutes each day to pray for the unborn during the 40 Days for Life campaign. After the largest 40 Days for Life campaign ever, with hearts and minds changed and lives saved, it is clear that momentum is on the side of life. The next internationally coordinated 40 Days for Life campaign runs from March 1 - April 9, 2017.

An endorsement from POPE FRANCIS via Vatican Secretariat of State: "The Holy Father greatly appreciates the dedicated work that you and everyone involved in 40 Days for Life are engaged in to promote respect for the lives of all unborn children. His Holiness assures you of his prayerful support for you, your colleagues and all those whose prayer, fasting and sacrifices are saving countless lives and giving glory to God."

Although the Jubilee of Mercy has ended, Pope Francis has decided that some of the novelties he applied to the Church during the Holy Year will continue. He is allowing all priests to absolve the sin of abortion. In the United States the faculty to absolve abortion has already been delegated to all priests. However, the Pope's new provisions take it to a universal level.

The Pope announced his decision in his new Apostolic Letter "Misericordia et Misera," meaning "Mercy with Misery." Published Nov. 21, the letter was signed by the Pope on November 20th during Mass for the close of the Jubilee Year of Mercy.

In the letter, Pope Francis said that "the Sacrament of Reconciliation must regain its central place in the Christian life." "Given this need, lest any obstacle arise between the request for reconciliation and God's forgiveness, I henceforth grant to all priests, in virtue of their ministry, the faculty to absolve those who have committed the sin of procured abortion,".

I pray you will have a very Merry Christmas as you gather with family and friends to thank the Lord for all of His blessings. God bless each of you. Have a great day every day. LIFE IS A GIFT.
