We have just completed three successful Grand Knight Mid-Term meetings in January. These were very well attended and provided your Grand Knight with an abundance of information and activities for you to become involved with. There's got to be something out there that interests you! You can become involved in and help your councils in areas such as: Council Free Throw competitions, Intellectual Disability drives, Special Olympic activities, Veteran's program activities just to name a few. PLEASE consider helping out in some way to show everyone in your Council, parish and community the great things we do for others.

As we approach the holy season of Lent I ask you all to consider getting involved in the many parish and council activities that this season has to offer. Finally a few bookkeeping items for Grand Knights and Officers:

- Councils should have completed the Annual Fraternal Survey, Form 1728, and submitted it to Supreme and the State. This is an extremely important form to be filed that allows the Knights of Columbus to maintain its tax exempt status with the Federal Government. Please complete it and send if you haven't already;
- Council Audits should be in progress and completed in the next few weeks;
- Per Capita bills were mailed out to councils who still owe for this fraternal year. Grand Knights should ensure the amount is paid timely so as not to be in jeopardy of suspension.

I wish you all the very best as we move into the coming months where the work of the Knights is seen and appreciated by so many people!

Dear Brother Knights:

Today is January 19 and I am sitting on a bus coming home from The March for Life in Washington, DC with 40 students from my school and I am using my phone to prepare this monthly Membership report – certainly a statement that was not uttered 20 or 30 years ago, but technology has allowed us to better forward our message and be more productive with our time.

When this newsletter is published, we will have completed our Mid Term Grand Knight meetings. By "taking our show on the road" and not hosting one, centralized meeting, we were able to reach many Grand Knights and Membership Chairmen and discuss the progress made in the first six months of the Columbian Year and our plans for the second half of the Columbian Year.

At the conclusion of December, 2017, the State of New Jersey brought in 907 new members towards our first half of the Columbian Year goal of 1,230 new members – that is 73.74%. This represents tremendous efforts by the local councils to grow our Order. I encourage you to continue to schedule Admission Degrees and recruit new members to those scheduled degrees. For the first six months of this Columbian Year, we met or exceeded our membership goals in those months where there were more Admission Degrees held than in the same month a year ago. The use of the video presentation of the Admission Degree has become more widely used and this has proven to be an effective tool in getting new members into our Order. If your Council is thinking about forming an Admission Degree team, talk with your District Deputy if you need assistance.

As positive as this first half membership number is, there are still 153 councils in the State of New Jersey that have not reported a new member this Columbian Year. In June, I challenged each District Deputy to bring in two new members per district each month. With more than 40% of the councils not bringing in a new member, it makes reaching this goal more difficult. If you are the Grand Knight or Membership Chairman of one of these councils, how can your District Deputy or Diocesan Membership Chairman assist you in recruiting new members? Are you reaching out for assistance or just accepting the status quo?

As reported in this column last month and discussed at the Grand Knight Mid Term meetings, On Line Membership goes live in New Jersey on February 5, 2018. When a member signs up on line, they will be asked if they want to join a local council. The Fraternal Benefits Department and Membership Team will assist in cultivating these online members to become degree members of your local council. This is a new method to attract members who are exploring membership in our Order via the internet. Please make sure that your council has an online presence so that information is available to prospective members.

These are exciting times and the State Membership Team will be with you every step of the way to assist you. If you need our help, please feel free to contact us.

## Highlighted Programs of the Month

## Keep Christ Before Us

Every year at this time, CCD classes across the state are preparing the 2<sup>nd</sup> graders for their First Holy Communion in May, and some are preparing older children for their Confirmation. Wouldn't it be a nice present for your Council to donate a First Communion Kit or Confirmation book to the children in your Parish. Councils across the state have been doing this for a few years now and not only do the children get great use of them, but the parents, as well as your Pastor, appreciate this gesture.

The Communion kits have a Missal for the children, and also come with a Scapular and Rosary Beads, black for boys, white for girls. Sometimes parents have trouble locating the white rosary beads at a reasonable price, with these books, they are included. While being useful to the children now, the books become a keepsake for the family. I can also email your Council a template for a small label you can apply to the front of the book with the emblem of the order and your Council number on it.


The Confirmation book helps the children prepare for their upcoming Sacrament, it has the ceremony in there, as well as

## Save a Life

Since the inception of the Ultrasound Initiative program, we have placed several machines with pregnancy care centers throughout the state, secure in the knowledge that if a woman is given the opportunity to view an ultrasound, she will choose life over abortion 80% to 90% of the time. However, a recent survey of PPCs that received an ultrasound machine through this program revealed that the cost per client for its use ranged from \$82 to \$438.

While our Ultrasound Initiative has demonstrated excellent results, some PCCs incur added costs that require them to reallocate resources to operate and maintain the new machine for a five- to 10-year period. In addition, we know that some PCCs are in serious financial positions that may reduce their capacity to fulfill their mission of providing expectant mothers with a no-cost opportunity to make an informed decision on their pregnancy.

We must therefore provide ongoing support for these centers by raising money to offset these costs. Funds could be used to cover the following (and possible other) costs:

- PCC sonographer and counseling salaries
- Ultrasound machine maintenance
- Supplies
- Educational materials
- Insurance costs
- Training
- Payment of equipment upgrades (such as enhanced sound capacity or a flat-screen monitor)

If the cost per client for an ultrasound is anywhere from \$82 to \$438, and we know that women viewing the ultrasound overwhelmingly choose life, then this is, in effect, the cost to Save a Life. Your council should strive to support these centers by making donations to save lives. This is one way in which our donations can have a direct, real world, impact in promoting the Culture of Life. In Church Activities, please get involved in our Seminarian Letters Program, the reports must be in by 3/31. Our Future Priests need our support, and this is a fantastic way to show them how much we care. Also start planning to order your Keep Christ Before Us Easter coloring books due 3/1 and the Holy Communion and Confirmation Books due 4/1 from John Gazis. The Parochial and CCD Teacher of the Year forms must be into your DD by 2/1/18. As well as the CHAPLAIN OF THE YEAR due 3/31. There are 362 Council, there should be 362 applications. GET THEM IN!!

For Community Activities, we have the deadline for the following coming up. The EMT, Sr Citizen, Police and Fireman of the Year forms need to be submitted by 2/1. We need to take care of our Veterans as the weather gets colder and gloomier. The Eyes for the Needy report needs to be submitted by 3/31 and the Food for the Hungry reports are also due to the Chairman by 3/31.

In Youth Activities, The Catholic Citizenship Contest must be completed by the Councils by Jan 30, and sent to the DD's by Feb 28<sup>th</sup>. One of the most important things to do this year is to have completed the SAFE AWARENESS program. All those involved in Youth Activities MUST complete this Program. 
