State Deputy's Message

Brothers,

Last month, continuing our recent change, we conducted three Grand Knight Mid-Term meetings in three different locations in the state. As you are probably aware, the three meetings are done to reduce the travel time, and thereby, increase the attendance. We did, in fact, have very good attendance at all three meetings and our membership and program teams did a fabulous job providing important information to you. Along with the basics about membership and programs, the Grand Knights in attendance also were shown a video of the new combined Degree Ceremony.

For those of you who are not aware, as of January 15th we have gone to a combined First, Second, and Third Degree Ceremony. One of the great features of this new combined degree is that secrecy is no longer required. This means that whenever you hold a degree, you can invite family, friends and parishioners to observe and see what the Knights are all about. This has already proved extremely popular and will help in reaching our membership goal.

Some of the programs coming up that your councils may want to get involved in are the Free Throw Competition, Intellectual Disability and Alzheimer's drives, and Special Olympics activities. With Spring right around the corner, now is a good time to keep our Veteran's in mind and maybe plan an outing at a local ballpark. And, don't forget to put your nominations in for the various awards – especially Chaplain of the Year.

We are also approaching the Holy Season of Lent and there are many activities in the Faith in Action program that your councils can do which will enhance yours, your family's and your parishioner's spirituality. As we have said many times, if you haven't done so already, sit down with your Pastor and review the Faith in Action booklet with him and together come up with activities which will benefit the parish, your council and the Knights.

After the slow start to our Fraternal year, membership continues to rise and as of December 31st, we were 9% ahead of last year numbers. This is due to the hard work of every one of you. Our Online program continues to be very strong and successful in bringing in new members and we are continuously one of the top five jurisdictions in Online Membership. We still have some work to do on retention, however, but overall your efforts are paying off. And I speak for the rest of the State Officers when I offer a sincere Thank You.

Dear Brothers,

As of the writing of this article we stand at 885 new members for slightly over 41 % of our goal.

As mentioned in the beginning of the year we had a financial incentive program and the Council winners in each Diocese for the first half of the fraternal year will be announced shortly.

Also have you asked someone to join. The Power of 1. Imagine where we would be if we each member brought in 1 new member. How our councils would flourish as well as our programs.

We held our Mid-Year DD and GK meetings and at these meetings the new combined degree called "Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity" was shown. This will be a great tool in recruiting new and younger members. They will be able to obtain all degrees in one session. This can be done in your council or church. Your GK and DD should be able to explain the details as the information was given to them at these meetings. The new degree can be used immediately as the scripts are available from the Supreme web site. After 6/30/2020 we will no longer be doing the old 1st, 2nd & 3rd degrees in NJ. This is also an opportunity to get members who have not taken their 2nd or 3rd degrees to advance. They can participate in the new combined degree and not need to do all degrees individually.

This degree, as well as the Delta Church Drive, should be great tools in recruitment. This is a great way to attract the younger prospects. They can also participate while their families and friends can observe.

With the information above about the new combined degrees you can still hold the older individual degrees if your council wishes to do them till 6/30/20.

We have started the new incentive program for the second half of the fraternal year. It is never to late to start. Many Diocese were very close with their recruitment efforts.

As always, the membership team and I are here to help you along the way. Please do not hesitate to contact any of us for help. Our contact info is listed in the state directory and on the state website.

Remember one of the main reasons someone has not joined is he was never asked. Ask someone. What is the worst they can say, No?

REPORT OF THE CEREMONIALS CHAIRMAN

Dear Brothers:

On November 24 and 25, 2019, in my role as State Ceremonial Chairman, I represented the State of New Jersey at a meeting in Orlando, Florida. The purpose of this meeting was to respond to a resolution from the State of Illinois, presented at the Supreme Convention in August, 2019, which called for the Supreme Council to consider the reconfiguration of the Admission, Formation, and Knighthood Degrees into one, unified degree. Supreme Council, in responding to this resolution, presented at this meeting a single degree that exemplifies the first three principles of our Order.

As a church, we must again become a church that evangelizes. In recent years, the Roman Catholic Church has seen:

- ✤ A decrease in baptism of 40%
- Sacramental marriage is down by 66%
- Attendance at mass is down 50% so that only 20% of those who identify as Catholic attend mass on a regular basis

This new degree, **The Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity**, is rooted in the past but moves the Order towards the future. In the 19th Century, men wanted secrecy and progression, a journey, towards knighthood. The thought was this would inspire men to seek leadership roles within the local council. Today, councils lack the manpower to host ceremonial teams. This new ceremonial will address the limitations on resources that local councils encounter.

This degree is now available to councils for use and the following is the plan for implantation of these changes:

- New Jersey will continue with the three existing degrees until June 30, 2020.
- The new degree can be used by any council as the scripted material is now available to be downloaded from the Supreme website. This will run simultaneous with the existing degrees until June 30, 2020 at which time the new ceremonial will be the only ceremonial used in the State of New Jersey.
- The degree will be posted on the State website by the Host Grand Knight by selecting "Charity, Unity, and Fraternity Degree" as the degree option.
- The new ceremonial can be presented by any council. It can be read by a degree team, recited from
 memory by the degree team, or presented in a video presentation (once the degree video is released by
 the Supreme Council). Degree teams will be observed and certified by the District Deputy. The degree
 team consists of four members with speaking roles, the council chaplain or parish priest (speaking role),
 and a warden (non-speaking role).
- The Degree Team will wear the Ceremonial Baldric while exemplifying the degree. The use of robes by Degree Teams will cease on June 30, 2020.
- When exemplifying the new degree, there is a need for a lapel pin, rosary, and the fiber and cable. There are no other materials needed for the exemplification of the new degree. There is no knighting ceremony at the conclusion of the new degree.
- The new degree can be held in church or a council chamber. The ceremony will be open to family, friends, and parishioners.
- This ceremonial will be available to teams in several languages (Spanish, French, Polish, etc.)

Since we are less than 4 months until the Annual Awards Ceremony in May, we need your help in sending in your State Program Reports and Application (see Program List and "State Council Reporting Forms") before the various February/March deadlines to be recognized at the State Convention.

There are 2 programs I would really like to focus on this month. The first is the Intellectual Disabilities Drive. As all who attended the GK Mid-Term meetings heard the monetary donations have been dropping over the years. We at the State Council don't feel it is because of a lack of participation. It seems more likely that this is reporting issue. Please remember that as much as the Councils disagree with sending all monies from the Intellectual Disabilities Drive to the State Council it is a requirement of the IRS. Councils are not allowed to collect the money and send it to their organization of choice. Also remember that ALL of the 10% taken by the State Council from the Intellectual Disabilities Drives goes to NJ Special Olympics. None of this money goes anywhere else. Remember, the first principle of our order CHARITY. We are all in this for those who need our help.

With the upcoming Lenten Season the second program I would like to highlight is The Good Friday Family Promotion program. Throughout Lent, we focus on the great mystery which is the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. However, we must not lose sight of the fact that without Good Friday, there is no Easter Sunday. The sacrifice of the Lamb on Good Friday is at the very heart of our salvation. This year, to help us refocus on the importance of Good Friday, a program has been created to encourage all the faithful to rediscover the mystery and magnificence of the Good Friday Service. 

Completing these forms require just a few keystrokes and click "Submit".

Do not *assume* your membership is too old to use computers to read your Council's newsletter and communication.

Here are some items/deadlines for Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries to keep in mind:

- The Annual Fraternal Survey, Form 1728, was due January 31st. If you have not done so, it is imperative that you submit this immediately. This is an extremely important form to be filed that allows the Knights of Columbus to maintain its tax-exempt status with the Federal Government.
- Council Audits are due February 15th and again this is a requirement of the IRS
- Per Capita bills were mailed out to councils who still owe for this fraternal year. Remember, this does not need to be voted on. It is a requirement for each council to complete and submit in a timely manner to avoid suspension.
