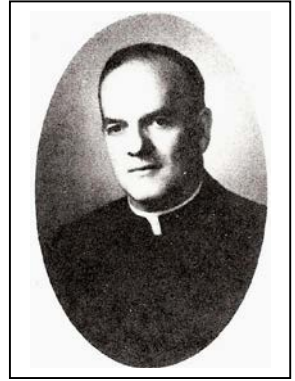

◆ Sonograms Will Soon Be Offered on a Van – Drivers Needed

A new pregnancy care service is being offered in Montgomery County. Centro Tepeyac Women's Center, in collaboration with Birthright, will soon offer sonograms from its new Metro Storks sonogram van. Licensed drivers are needed to operate the Mercedes Sprinter van (regular driver's license) to different areas in the county so that vulnerable women can be offered on board life-saving sonograms. The responsibility of the driver is to get the van from St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church in Silver Spring to sites near abortion clinics and back again. There will be a nurse, sonographer and counselor on board to assist the women. Drivers are needed for Tuesdays and Thursdays for 2-4 hours and on Saturdays for 4 hours. ◆ Maryland Against Physician Assisted Suicide

Compassion & Choices continues to make Maryland a priority to pass legislation that would legalize physician assisted suicide, and they will do whatever it takes to win. They are already organizing people and legislators to support such legislation in the 2017 General Assembly session. Even though January 2017 feels like a long time away, we need to be just as aggressive in our efforts to oppose physician assisted suicide to ensure it does not pass into law in 2017.

Today, we are asking all of our supporters to email their state Senator and state Delegate and **ask them not to co-sponsor or support any physician assisted suicide legislation that is filed in 2017.**

Anyone is welcome to enroll anyone they choose (family, friends, loved ones) in the society. The person being enrolled does not have to be a member of the Knights of Columbus.

Next of kin will receive a letter of condolence from the Perpetual Memorial Society Chairman. The donor will be sent an email or letter of appreciation if desired for using the Perpetual Memorial Society as a way of remembering and praying for their loved ones for eternity.

The amount of the donation will never be revealed. Donations should be made to the Maryland State Council, with "Perpetual Memorial Society" on the check's memo line. All donations will be used for Vocations programs throughout the State of Maryland. Each year a proper accounting of monies raised will be reported at the annual State Convention.

The Perpetual Memorial Society will maintain a book of names enrolled and the book will be present, on the Altar, at every Mass offered at functions of the Maryland State Council. The book will show the enrollee's name, year of birth and death, as well as the donor's name. 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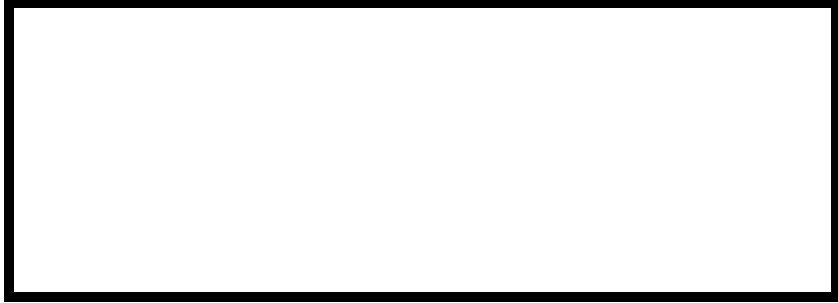
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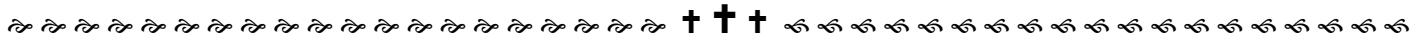
