

CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

"Lord have mercy." Words that take on special meaning during Lent, especially for Knights who seek to exemplify and serve the heavenly court. What is the mercy we seek? Is it merely that God should forgive us our sins? No. The mercy of Lent is much more than this. Turning to venerable tradition, we seek not just English mercy, but Latin pietas and misericordia... words from the mass which encompass the forgiveness of sin, but go much further.

The Catholic sense of mercy always includes pietas, that is: compassion, gentleness, kindness, and devoted love... and misericordia: compassion moved specifically by the appreciation of one's miserable state. It's the mercy of the Good Samaritan... the love Jesus felt when seeing the crowds living like sheep without a shepherd his heart was moved with pity for them. It's the mercy Jesus showed Mary Magdalene when he lifted her from the dirt. This is the fullness of mercy.

It's simpler to see the world only in terms of juridical mercy, but it's not enough. Consider this: a friend once observed, "*Ninety percent of what we do is a reaction to pain.*" I'm not sure if that's completely accurate, but there's some truth there.

Do I see others only for their sins? Or do I also seek to feel, understand and heal their pain, their miseria? Good questions to orient us as Knights during the holy season of Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday, February 18.

DISTRICT DEPUTY'S REPORT







Knights Present 500th Ultrasound Machine Program Celebrates 5 Years, 50 States – 500 Machines

On November 4, 2014, the Knights of Columbus funded the purchase of an ultrasound machine for a Baltimore area pregnancy center, making it the 500th such gift by the Knights to a pregnancy center dedicated to helping women keep and care for their unborn babies. "When we began this program five years ago, we hoped to put a machine in every state," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson before presenting the ultrasound machine to the Greater Baltimore Center for Pregnancy Concerns for use at its Dundalk, MD, facility. "But this program has been even more successful because of the great need and the generosity of brother Knights from coast to coast." He added: "Not only has this program saved the lives of countless unborn children, but it has saved many mothers – and fathers – from a lifetime of regret."

Anderson made the presentation along with the Knights' Supreme Chaplain and Archbishop of Baltimore William Lori at an annual meeting of K of C leaders from around the world held at the Baltimore Hilton. The Knights' Ultrasound Initiative began in January 2009 with 13 machines purchased in the first year. The program has since expanded to all 50 U.S. states, Canada and Jamaica, and employs the latest technology that allows a mother to see clearly the child alive in her womb. U.S. states with the largest number of ultrasound machines funded by the Knights include Texas (40), Missouri (35), Florida (34), California (33) and Michigan (30). The latest ultrasound machine with K of C funding is the 12th to be located in Maryland.

The program encourages state and local Knights councils to assist qualified pregnancy resource centers in their areas by raising half the cost of an ultrasound machine. The K of C Supreme Council's Culture of Life Fund then matches those dollars to contribute to the purchase of a machine, with the cost per machine starting at about \$20,000. To date, Knights of Columbus councils have spent nearly \$7.5 million, with just over \$7.5 million provided by the Supreme Council. The total value of the ultrasound machines provided thus far is nearly \$26 million. The initiative continues to expand and adapt to changing needs. For example, in recent years there has been a rise in the use of mobile ultrasound machines that can serve a number of communities.

Council Participates in 42nd Annual March for Life



Brother Dana Perry, his wife Chris, Elsie Bergamini, and Marilyn Goldhammer represented our Council with other parishioners from St. Patrick's, St. Peter's, and St. Mary's churches in the annual March for Life in Washington, D.C. on THU/JAN/22. St. Patrick's provided a bus; it was full. Our Council contributed \$100 toward the \$850 bus' cost. Riders donated \$230 more and an anonymous donor contributed \$150.



Attendees heard Supreme Knight Carl Anderson's stirring speech advocating life on the main stage, on the mall before the march. <u>The enthusiasm among the participants was contagious and the number of young marchers was awe-inspiring!</u> The march was led by an entire high school contingent from North Dakota who came to D.C. in eight buses.


