



Victory in Baltimore for Pregnancy Care Centers:

After a five-year legal battle against the city of Baltimore, U.S. District Judge Marvin J. Garbis issued a summary judgement overturning an ordinance requiring crisis pregnancy centers to post signs telling clients they do not provide or refer for surgical or medical abortions. The suit, brought by the Baltimore Center for Pregnancy Concerns, is a significant Frist Amendment victory over government trying to enforce "compelled speech" ordinances, requiring pregnancy care centers to post signs or otherwise convey a message that opposes their deep-seated views. The city can appeal the ruling.

In a similar targeting law, a U.S. District Judge ruled in 1993 that Montgomery County could not enforce a law requiring Centro Tepeyac's Silver Spring Women's Center to post signs telling women it had no licensed medical practitioner on staff. The County paid \$375,000 in damages, attorney fees and court costs.

40 Days for Life: On October 31, the 34th day of the fall campaign which began on September 28, the 40 Days for Life staff reports that 527 mothers have decided against abortion and chosen life for their babies. What a great outcome, and the campaign continues.

Here are some of the things that happened during the Fall 40 Days campaign in Germantown:

- 18 SAVES (13 were late term)
- Two workers left the clinic
- A woman has filed a lawsuit against Carhart (could cost him money and his license)
- On October the 15th baby Adrian was born. His mother came to the clinic during the Spring 40 Days campaign, did not abort and delivered him during the Fall 40 Days campaign.

Another MD Late-Term Abortionist Loses His Medical License

The Maryland Board of Physicians has revoked the medical license of late-term abortionist Harold O. Alexander, effective November 4, 2016. The revocation stemmed from a complaint that Alexander had breached the standard of patient care in his treatment of a woman, who went to his Integrated Ob/Gyn abortion facility in Forestville for an abortion at 28 weeks into her pregnancy in February 2014. Although Alexander determined that her baby was already dead when she arrived at his facility, he conducted an abortion procedure for which he would be paid, rather than

referring her to a hospital for an obstetrical delivery. The Board said it had no confidence that Alexander possesses the ability to practice medicine safely, especially since he was on probation at the time and that the previous disciplinary action failed to reform his behavior. The Board acknowledged that Alexander's office: was not licensed as an abortion facility; had no surgical equipment in the event a surgical procedure was required; employed no licensed assistants; had no hospital privileges or hospital transfer agreement; and conducted abortions in the middle of the night, indicating that he was attempting to operate under the radar.

The Holy Family Prayer Program began August 5 at the 132rd Supreme Convention in Philadelphia, PA. It features an image of the Holy Family. (See photo below.) Each Knights of Columbus jurisdiction received several Holy Family images to be used as the centerpiece of prayer services conducted in churches and council meeting places throughout the Order for the duration of the program.



The Holy Family Prayer Program is the 17th Marian Prayer Program sponsored by the Knights of Columbus, beginning with the first program – honoring Mary under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe - in 1979. In preparation for the 1982 Centennial of the Order, the second prayer program was initiated, which highlighted the Holy Family. Since then, the Blessed Mother has been honored by her Knights under her titles of Our Lady of

Perpetual Help, Our Lady of Czestochowa, Our Lady of Pochaiv, Our Lady of the Assumption, Our Lady of the Rosary and Our Lady of Charity.

These Orderwide programs of Marian Prayer have since gathered together more than 16 million people at some 140,000 prayer services conducted at local councils and parishes. Please consider reciting the prayer below as your part to honor the Holy Family.
