The Pitfalls of Replacing Coverage

You know the old saying, "the grass seems greener on the other side of the fence," but we all know that it rarely is. The same holds true when it comes to replacing your existing Knights of Columbus life insurance with coverage offered by another company. Perceptions are deceiving. A move to the "greener" grass on the other side of the fence might seem like a good one, but it can leave you with less *green* in your wallet — in some cases, a lot less. That's why it pays to remember another old adage, "Read the fine print."

There are many reasons to keep your existing coverage in force, whether that coverage is with the Knights of Columbus or with another company. I'll focus on the potential pitfalls of replacing coverage here — pitfalls that an agent trying to convince you that the grass actually is greener might neglect to mention.

First, all life insurance contracts contain a *contestability period*, which allows the insurer to contest claims made for a period — typically two years — after the contract is issued. Chances are this is no longer an issue with your current coverage.

Second, it's unlikely that you can obtain the same amount of coverage, for the same premium, that you were able to obtain with your existing contract. The two factors that determine how much you'll need to pay for life insurance coverage are age and health. Certainly, you're older now than you were when you took out your current coverage. There's no way around that. And you have to ask yourself, has your health changed during that time? Is your blood pressure the same? Your cholesterol? Have you gained weight? All these factors can affect the amount of coverage you'll get for your premium dollar. If someone encourages you to replace — or worse, drop your existing coverage, please call me. I'll show you how your existing coverage is working for you and why replacement is rarely in your best interest.

Safe Havens for Newborns



In Maryland, as in every state in the nation, no one ever has to abandon a newborn baby. Under Maryland's Safe Haven law, a distressed parent who is unable or unwilling to care for their infant can safely give up custody of their baby, no questions asked. Newborns can be left at a hospital or law enforcement station. A parent (or another adult with the approval of the mother) has up to 10 days from the birth to invoke Safe Haven anonymously and safely leave a baby with a responsible adult at a designated location. A person who invokes Safe Haven is immune from civil liability or criminal prosecution provided the child is unharmed. Persons with questions about Maryland's Safe Haven law can call 800-332-6347.

FOR 17TH YEAR, KNIGHTS' CHARITABLE GIVING AND VOLUNTEER HOURS GROW



The Knights of Columbus set a new all-time record last year for charitable donations and service hours with \$175,079,192 in donations and more than 73.5 million hours of service. The numbers were announced at the closing session of the annual Organizational Meeting of State Deputies in New Haven. "We are very proud of these Fraternal Survey numbers," Supreme Knight Anderson said. "These are a clear indication that we are keeping faith with Father McGivney's principle of charity and also of unity, not only among ourselves, but with those in need. This is what we call a charity that evangelizes. This is what makes Knights of Columbus different."

Supreme Knight Anderson went on to say that these records of giving perfectly illustrate the point made by Father Tomasz Kraj, Poland Associate State Chaplain and Theologian in Residence at the Saint John Paul II National Shrine, in his homily during the Mass that preceded the closing session. Father Kraj said that the world needs more men who pay witness through their actions to what it means to be a Catholic. "We are answering Pope Francis' call to go to the peripheries," the supreme knight said. "We can reach half way around the globe to help those in need and we can reach to our neighbor next door. And we do that every day. That makes us witnesses to the faith."

The number of service hours rose by more than a million over the previous year's total, according to the Knights of Columbus Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity for the year ending Dec. 31, 2015. Donations grew by more than \$1.5 million since 2014, achieving an increase in giving for the 17th consecutive year. The top ten jurisdiction in charitable giving (from highest) were: Texas, California, Florida, Quebec, Illinois, Michigan, Ontario, New York, Missouri and New Jersey. For volunteer hours, the top ten were: Luzon North, Texas, Illinois, Florida, California, Luzon South, Ontario, Michigan, Visayas and Pennsylvania.

Supreme Knight Anderson pointed out that while these numbers are impressive, jurisdiction leaders need to focus now on ensuring that the Order grows in charitable giving and volunteer service during the coming 2016-17 fraternal year. The Knights continued to support their local communities in 2015 through such programs as Aid to Christians at Risk, Coats for Kids, the Food for Families initiative and blood drives. Knights also gave assistance to Habitat for Humanity, the Global Wheelchair Mission and other large-scale charitable organizations.

Tribute to Bishop Giuseppe Nazzaro (1937–2015) Article Courtesy: Donald Hemke, F.S.



In October 2015, our council lost a brother knight named Giuseppe Nazzaro, who as a Franciscan Missionary priest born in San Potito Ultra (Avellino) Italy in 1937, spent only 5% of his life in the USA! Fr. Nazzaro was ordained in 1965 and served as a parish priest in Italy and Egypt. In 1977 his assignments changed to administration and teaching in various capacities in Egypt, the Holy Land, and in Rome. In 1983 he was Chaplain of the Italian Military Contingent of the Multinational Force in service in the south of the Sinai Peninsula at Sharm El-Scheikh. In 1992, he was elected "Custos of the Holy Land."

Fr. Nazzaro joined the council in 1994, at age 57, when he was assigned to the USA to establish and lead the "Holy Land Foundation" that solicits support of Christian communities in the Holy Land. He supported council activities during the four years he served at the Foundation in the USA.

In 2001, he was sent to Syria at Damascus-Salhieh as parish priest at St. Anthony of Padua. *In 2003, Fr. Nazzaro was chosen Apostolic Vicar of Allepo by Saint John Paul II and was appointed Bishop serving until 2013*. Bishop Nazzaro was asked to bring attention to the tragedy faced by war-torn Syrian people. Let us pay tribute to his life and dedication to spreading the Good News in the Middle East at a time when Christianity is under assault each and every day!
