


Project Rachel Ministry

Maryland's KofC Ultrasound Program

In Maryland, the KofC has donated 23 ultrasound machines to Pregnancy Care Centers throughout the state. Blocking Federal Funds for Abortion

On May 22, 25 Republican senators requested that the Senate appropriations committee decline to advance any bills with language that would weaken or remove pro-life or proreligious liberty measures currently in place. They cited the Protecting Life in Global Health Assistance policy, which blocks funding to organizations that promote abortions, and the updated rule for Title X of the Public Health Services Act, which prohibits Title X money from going to clinics that perform abortions. Planned Parenthood is set to lose millions of dollars in federal funding due to this new rule.

Maryland Abortion Funding Now Law

Before the Maryland General Assembly adjourned for this year, it passed the Family Planning Program Funding Bill (SB904/HB1272) which prohibits the Maryland Department of Health from accepting Title X federal funding if it excludes abortion providers – which it does. The bill replaces these funds

at the same level from the state budget, i.e., from state tax dollars. Maryland Right to Life estimates that as many as 50,000 Marylanders petitioned Governor Hogan to veto the bill. The governor took no action and the bill became law without his signature.

Where Do the Presidential Candidates Stand on Abortion?

- **Joe Biden, former vice president**, has endorsed repealing the Hyde amendment, a measure that prohibits federal funding of abortion except in cases of rape, incest, or when the mother's life is endangered.
- **Bernie Sanders, Vermont senator**, wants a national law legalizing abortion up to birth.
- Kamala Harris, California senator, wants states that have had pro-life laws struck down by the courts to obtain Justice Department approval before they can implement any new pro-life laws.
- Elizabeth Warren, Massachusetts senator, announced a plan to legalize abortions for any reason up to birth and force taxpayers to pay for them.
- **Kirsten Gillibrand, New York senator**, identifies herself as Catholic, but disagrees with the Church on abortion, LGBTQ issues, and an all-male priesthood.
- Amy Klobuchar, Minnesota senator, would sign legislation codifying abortion rights supporting abortion up to birth.
- Pete Buttigieg, mayor of South Bend, described the killing of unborn babies as "an American freedom," and does not want the government to restrict abortions in any way at any stage of development.
- Cory Booker, New Jersey senator, has pledged to create a White House office exclusively dedicated to protecting so-called abortion "rights," and would have a pro-Roe v. Wade litmus test for judicial nominees.
- **Beto O'Rourke, former Texas congressman**, said a third-trimester abortion "should be a decision that the woman makes about her body."

Defend Life

Defend Life is a local organization that promotes the pro-life cause. Defend Life provides wonderful pro-life speakers to parishes free of charge. Defend Life will once again hold the "Face the Truth Tour". This is the 19th annual tour: July 29 to August 2. The tour consists of three stops a day at busy locations to show the public what abortion really entails. As Fr. Pavone of "Priests for Life" has said: "Until Americans see abortion, Americans will not reject abortion". Most stops are in Maryland but one is in DC and one in West Virginia. While there are "Core Team Members" who participate in the entire event (food and lodging provided free of charge) anyone is welcome to join in and hold signs and listen to speakers over lunch. One can attend events that are close-by. It's wonderful to get support from people driving by and when obscene gestures from the opposition are received, we know that we have been found worthy of being offended for the sake of our Lord. Be assured that this is all legal and peaceful. To the occasional insult one responds, "God bless you". PROVIDING PEACE TO REFUGEES

Peace Center supported by Knights of Columbus in South Korea gives refugees shelter and education

SEOUL, South Korea, 06/20/2019 — Two single mothers fled with their children from Egypt to South Korea to escape persecution. They entered a country with little to no financial support or knowledge of the Korean language and culture.

But South Korean Knights of Columbus gave them peace of mind.

Andy Daeun Lee of St. Andrew Taegon Kim Council 16000 established the Peace Refugee Center — also known as "Peace Home." He retired as a psychologist in 2007, and now provides counseling to refugees.

One refugee was a single mother who fled to South Korea with her infant. As soon as he met the mother, Lee said

he knew he wanted to do more than provide counseling and job placement.

"I felt that it was more than necessary to provide the sleeping place, food and clothing needed for themselves and their babies," Lee said. "I asked the Korean Knights of Columbus to build the Peace Refugee Center to help refugees in Korea as one of its charitable organizations."

On April 10, Peace Refugee Center was opened. Supreme Knight Carl Anderson attended the ceremony along with Bishop Francis Xavier Soo-il Yu of the Military Ordinariate of Korea, who blessed the facility.

"The Knights of Columbus gives us a new way to express today the Korean tradition of the role of the laity," Anderson said to the local council leaders present. "We do this by offering a practical way to follow a path of Catholic brotherhood."

The Knights of Columbus has been present in South Korea since 2007, with seven councils — three military, four civilian — and more than 175 members.

The facility provides legal assistance for refugees to obtain visa recognition, which can take from 5 to 6 years. The Peace Refugee Center will help provide food, clothing and daycare, as well as develop skills necessary for employment including learning the Korean language and culture.

"The ultimate goal of the Peace Refugee Center is to help refugees settle down and live in Korea," Lee said.

In addition, Lee offers psychological counseling.

"They must be encouraged enough to survive in a totally different country," Lee said. "Full of psychological, mental and spiritual strength."

Knights of Columbus councils support refugees all over the world through the Supreme Council's Christian Refugee Relief Fund. The Knights of Columbus also championed the Iraq and Syria Genocide Relief and Accountability Act of 2018 signed last December by President Donald Trump.

"The Knights of Columbus has an honored mission to devote and develop life, liberty and peace in this Korean land," Lee said. "I pray and strive to be faithful to this call of God as a Knight of Columbus."

REFLECTIONS

The Continuing Struggle for Souls (by Lawrence P. Grayson)

In January 1947, then-Monsignor Fulton J. Sheen, a professor of philosophy at The Catholic University of America, delivered a radio address titled, "Signs of Our Times," in which he issued a warning about the battle for souls and provided advice on how to respond. His commentary, a brief excerpt of which follows, is even more relevant to the highly secularized culture of today than it was to the society of seven decades ago.

"Why is it that so few realize the seriousness of our present crisis? Partly because men do not want to believe their own times are wicked, partly because it involves too much selfaccusation and principally because they have no standards outside of themselves by which to measure their times. If there is no fixed concept of justice how shall men know it is violated? Only those who live by faith really know what is happening in the world. The great masses without faith are unconscious of the destructive processes going on.

The battle lines are already being clearly drawn and the basic issues are no longer in doubt. From now on men will divide themselves into two religions — understood again as surrender to an absolute. The conflict of the future is between the absolute who is the God-man and the absolute which is the man-God; the God Who became man and the man who makes himself God; brothers in Christ and comrades in anti-Christ.

The anti-Christ will not be so called, otherwise he would have no followers. He will wear no red tights, nor vomit sulphur, nor carry a trident nor wave an arrow tail as the Mephistophiles in Faust. This masquerade has helped the devil convince men that he does not exist, for he knows that he is never so strong as when men believe that he does not exist. When no man recognizes, the more power he exercises. God has defined Himself as "I am Who am" and the Devil as "I am who am not".

His logic is simple: if there is no heaven there is no hell; if there is no hell, then there is no sin; if there is no sin, then there is no judge, and if there is no judgement then evil is good and good is evil.

How will he come in this new age to win followers to his religion? He will come disguised as the Great Humanitarian; he will talk peace, prosperity and plenty not as means to lead us to God, but as ends in themselves...[H]e will explain Guilt away psychologically as inhibited eroticism, make men shrink in shame if their fellowmen say they are not broadminded and liberal; he will be so broadminded as to identify tolerance with indifference to right and wrong, truth and error; he will spread the lie that men will never be better until they make society better and thus have selfishness to provide fuel for the next revolution; he will foster science but only to have armament makers use one marvel of science to destroy another; he will foster more divorces under the disguise that another partner is "vital"; he will increase love for love and decrease love for person; he will invoke religion to destroy religion; he will ... tell people who they should and should not marry and unmarry ...he will tempt Christians ...to sell freedom for security ... to desert the lofty pinnacles of truth where faith and reason reign, for those lower depths where the masses live on slogans and propaganda...Opinions not truths, commentators not teachers, Gallup polls not principles, nature not grace — and...to have a new religion without a Cross, a liturgy without a world to come, a city of man without a city of God, a religion to invoke a religion, or a politics which is a religion-one that renders unto Caesar even the things that are God's.

Because the signs of our times point to a struggle between absolutes we may expect the future to be a time of trials for two reasons: Firstly, to stop disintegration. Godlessness would go on and on if there were no catastrophes. ...Moral truth is vindicated by the ruin that follows when it has been repudiated. The chaos of our times is the strongest negative argument that could ever be advanced for Christianity.

The second reason why a crisis must come is in order to prevent a false identification of the Church and the world. Our Lord intended that those who are His followers should be different in spirit from those who were not. ... Mediocrity and compromise characterize the lives of many Christians. Many

read the same novels as modern pagans, educate their children in the same godless way, listen to the same commentators who have no other standard than judging today by yesterday, and tomorrow by today, allow pagan practices such as divorce and remarriage to creep into the family...There is no longer the conflict and opposition which is supposed to characterize us. We are influencing the world less than the world influences us.

The Church has survived other great crises in her nineteen centuries of existence and she will live to sing a requiem over the evils of the present. The Church may have its Good Fridays but these are only preludes to its Easter Sundays, for the Divine Promise shall never be made void: ". . . and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."

As Christians we must realize that a moment of crisis is not a time of despair, but of opportunity. The more we can anticipate the doom, the more we can avoid it. Once we recognize we are under Divine Wrath, we become eligible for Divine Mercy.

Catholics ought to stir up their faith, hang a crucifix in their homes to remind them that we too have to carry a cross, gather the family together every night to recite the rosary that through corporate prayer there might be intercession for the world; go to daily Mass that the spirit of love and sacrifice might be sprinkled in our business, our social life and our duties. More heroic souls might undertake the Holy Hour daily, particularly in parishes conscious of the needs of prayers of reparation as well as petition, conducting such devotions in their churches...

[I]n the coming age there will be only one way to stop your trembling knees, and that will be to get down on them and pray. The most important problem in the world today is your soul, for that is what the struggle is about."

What would our world be like if every Catholic followed his pastoral advice? It is not too late to do so. And do so we should, for as Msgr. Sheen said, "The time is nearer than you think."




