CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE Reverend Tom Cioffi, Associate Chaplain

Well here we are once again faced with the yearly dilemma of what self-sacrifice should we offer or give up for Lent. Sure we know the disciplines of Lent are fasting, abstinence, prayer, and alms giving. These are all good acts of self-denial and self-giving. But what if, rather than not eating between meals or giving up "sweets", or an increase of prayer or coins in the poor box, we decide to approach this Lent with a different twist.

Pope Francis suggests that we identify with Christ who by taking on our humanity He became poor so that by His poverty we might become rich. The Holy Father was using a verse from St. Paul's second letter to the Corinthians which reads: "for you know the gracious act of Our Lord Jesus Christ, that for your sake

he became poor although he was rich, so that by his poverty you might become rich." This idea of identifying with all who are poor in our presence is not always measured by those who lack monetary means. Sometimes poverty is seen in the faces of those who seek the love of Christ. In their poverty the poor, the homeless, the forgotten are right in our midst and yet we often fail to identify the opportunity to witness the richness of Christ in their presence.

In this context, I am reminded of the words from Mother Teresa who wrote: "At the end of life, we will not be judged by how many diplomas' we have received, how much money we have made, how many great things we have done. We will be judged that when, I was hungry, you gave me something to eat. When I was naked, you clothed me. When I was homeless, you took me in. ... Hungry, not only for bread, but hungry for your love. Naked, not only for clothing, but naked of human dignity and respect. Homeless, not only for a home of bricks, but homeless because of rejection."

During this Lenten season, let us be moved in our actions to care for those in great need because in their poverty they seek the same richness to become one in Christ and one with Christ.

Only Having Insurance "Through Work" Doesn't Work

Do you know anyone whose life or career has drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? It's very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family or group of friends is facing financial uncertainty. Maybe there's a possibility that you (or your spouse) could lose your job or change employers. Too many people have often relied on group term life insurance as their only safety net. Often, this insurance is an employee benefit provided at low or no cost. The existence of this coverage might convince someone that personally-owned life insurance is not necessary.

But only having "through work" insurance can leave you and your family vulnerable. Most group life insurance policies are limited in amount, which may be tied to salary or some other benchmark. These numbers are often capped, and this cap may be dangerously low when compared to your family's actual needs. In fact, a detailed needs analysis that evaluates your specific situation, will likely show that any employer-provided coverage falls short. In addition, the amount of group insurance offered is almost always reduced, sometimes dramatically, when you retire. You could one day find yourself without coverage, and if your health has changed (which it will as you age), you might also find yourself unable to secure individual protection. At the very least, it will definitely be more expensive.

While group life insurance can help, it does not replace the need for individually owned life insurance. I'll be happy to meet with you and provide a no-cost needs analysis, so you'll know exactly where you stand.


WELCOME SPRINGTIME PARTY FOR MARIAN ASSISTED LIVING RESIDENTS


