

There's something beautiful about the fact that the feast of St. Joseph (March 19) and that of the Annunciation (March 25) fall within a week of each other. Mary's "yes" to being the Mother of God astounds us... but so does Joseph's. This is not what he signed up for. 
Congratulations on raising \$3,500 for the Tootsie Roll charities in our County. Your fundraising efforts are heartily appreciated and for good causes!



Only Having "through work" Insurance Doesn't Work

Do you know anyone whose life has been drastically changed by the recent recession and economic downturn? With unemployment numbers rising, (the jobless rate was 8.1 percent in Feb. 2009, the highest since 1983), it's very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family or group of friends is facing financial uncertain now. With this uncertainty, there is a real possibility that you (or your spouse) could lose your job or change employers. Too many people have often relied on group term life insurance as their only safety net. Often, this insurance is an employee benefit provided at low or no cost. The existence of this coverage might convince someone that a personally owned life insurance policy is not necessary.

Only having "through work" insurance doesn't work. This way of thinking should be a thing of the past for many reasons. Most forms of group life insurance are limited in amount, which may be tied to salary or some other benchmark. These numbers are often capped, and this cap may be dangerously low for your family's actual needs. In fact, without a detailed needs analysis, any employer-provided coverage may be completely unrelated to needs at death.

In addition, the amount of group insurance offered is almost always reduced, sometimes dramatically, when you retire. With the possibility of these changes on the horizon, you could one day find yourself without coverage, and if your health has changed (which it has and will as you age), you might also find yourself unable to secure individual protection.

While group life insurance can help, it does not replace the need for individually owned life insurance. I'll be happy to meet with you and provide a no-cost needs analysis, so you'll know exactly where you stand.



The 2015 Warriors to Lourdes Pilgrimage for Wounded or Disabled Military Personnel for the 57th Annual International Military Pilgrimage will take place May 12-18, 2015. The pilgrimage, sponsored by the **Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA**, and the **Knights of Columbus**, is the latest event in a long history of both organizations' involvement in Lourdes and service to the military.

Military personnel and their designated caregivers (if applicable) will travel to the Marian shrine for a time of resting, praying and healing. The 5-day retreat will include special Masses, Eucharistic Procession and Benediction, Blessing of the Sick, a visit to the baths at the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes, a candlelight vigil and a closing ceremony that draws tens of thousands of troops to the sacred shrine every year. "We will journey and pray with pilgrims from around the world," said Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio of the Archdiocese of Military Services. "It will be an occasion to raise our hearts and minds to the Prince of Peace and beg for an increase in understanding and a decrease in strife."

Watch the mail for your 2015 council dues statement. The dues remain at \$45 this calendar year. There is a one dollar Culture of Life assessment from Supreme Council on each council, which is passed along to the membership on an "optional" basis. There's also an "optional" assessment of \$8 to help defray our council's cost of buying patron ads supporting four MD State Council KofC events for the calendar year.

New this year, we recommend paying your council dues and assessments using a credit or debit card on the council website (www.kofc6793.org) via our PayPal account. You'll need to pay the \$45 via the "Dues Payment" button. Then, if you elect to pay the \$1 Supreme Assessment and any of the Patron Advertisements, use the "Donation" button to pay these as a second-separate PayPal transaction.

Certainly, you may pay your dues and optional assessments using a single check and/or cash. We only ask that you maintain your excellent dues payment record by whichever payment method you choose.




