



On March 30, newly appointed Baltimore Auxiliary Bishop Mark Brennan blessed a new ultrasound machine at Mary's Center, a Catholic pregnancy care center in Glen Burnie. The unit was donated by the Maryland State Council, with the assistance of St. Philip Neri Council 14612. To date, 20 such units have been donated to pregnancy care centers throughout the state.

In the four Sunday-Wednesday periods of March in which he is in Germantown, Carhart performed 46 abortions: 19 one-day procedures, 14 two-day, 6 three-day, and 7 four-day. The later the gestational age of a baby, the longer is the procedure. The good news is that there were 6 saves last month. Mass continues to be offered every Saturday in an office with a wall that abuts the abortion clinic.

Every Thursday-Saturday, Carhart performs abortions at his facility in Bellevue, Nebraska, where late-term procedures are prohibited. Folks there report that in the last three weeks of March, he performed 95 abortions. On March 24 – his 16th consecutive day of work -- a patient who was in her 17th week of pregnancy was evacuated by ambulance to a nearby hospital emergency room. Carhart showed his concern for her heath by seeing five more patients the following day. The 75-year old abortionist has killed one abortion patient and hospitalized at least 15 others in the past five years.

Legend has it that St. Patrick drove the snakes from Ireland. It is no legend, however, that on St. Patrick's Day, March 17, the Planned Parenthood surgical abortion facility in Silver Spring closed its doors. After 20 years of operation, pro-life activists persuaded the property management company not to renew Planned Parenthood's lease using a narrowly-targeted educational campaign. Abortion is not good for neighboring businesses. With prayers and peaceful protest, and God's help, we'll close every abortion facility.

On March 30, Vice President Mike Pence voted to break a tie in the U.S. Senate to overturn a regulation forcing states to give Title X money to organizations that commit abortions. This was the first abortion-related vote in the Senate since the 2015 vote on the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act. The U.S. House had voted 230 to 188, on Feb. 16, to overturn this regulation. The bill does not require the President's signature because Congress can undo any agency regulations within 60 legislative days of their enactment.

The Knights of Columbus Supreme Council marked the 135th anniversary of the founding of the Order at a Mass on March 29 in St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Conn. The church is the site where Father Michael J. McGivney first gathered a group of Catholic men from the parish with the goal of providing for families of deceased breadwinners. March 29 marks the day when the organization received approval of its charter from the state of Connecticut in 1882.



Invocation by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori

"There is something timeless about people who are holy, because their lives speak to each new generation. Such is the case with Father McGivney," Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore said in his **homily**. "Father McGivney's priestly holiness is timeless and is just as relevant for us today as it was when he ministered to the people in this very church."


The supreme chaplain continued that like Pope Francis' example of charity today, Father McGivney was a man of mercy and charity. Concelebrating with the archbishop were Msgr. J. Peter Cullen, Connecticut state chaplain; Dominican Father Jonathan D. Kalisch, director of Chaplains and Spiritual Development and prior of St. Mary's Dominican Community; Dominican Father John Paul Walker, pastor of St. Mary's Parish; Father Joseph A. Marcello, pastor of St. Catherine of Siena Parish in Trumbull and priest-secretary emeritus to the supreme chaplain; and Dominican Father Marek Domeradzki of Poland. Father Louis Bianco was the master of ceremonies.

Attending the Mass were relatives of Venerable Michael J. McGivney and Knights from Connecticut. John Walshe, greatgrandnephew of Father McGivney, and Kay Walshe, were the gift bearers for the Mass. Brian V. Caulfield, vice-postulator for the cause for the canonization of Father McGivney, served as the lector.

After Mass, Archbishop Lori led supreme officers and their wives to the sarcophagus of Father McGivney located in the rear of the church, where they recited the Prayer for Canonization along with the congregation. The prayer was written in 2008, when the Vatican recognized the heroic virtue of Father McGivney and declared him a venerable Servant of God. A miracle attributed to his intercession is needed for him to advance to beatification.


