

Dear Brother Knights,

During October, we celebrate Respect Life Month. The Knights of Columbus have always been very involved in prolife efforts, not only fighting against the culture of death (for example, against abortion and euthanasia) but also promoting a consistent culture of life (in its work with Special Olympics, its various charitable works to aid the poor, the refugees, the sick, etc.).

Why is it so important, from a spiritual perspective, to respect life? To respect life in all its stages is to recognize that we are not the author or arbiter of our lives. Rather, that belongs to God: as St. Paul says, "whether we live or die, we are the Lord's" (Rom 14:8). The culture of death seeks to usurp this role from God, to remove Him from the picture - instead of turning to God, it seeks to redefine the meaning and value of life and turn it into a function of utility and ability. But we profess, as Christians, that being created in the image and likeness of God is enough. The Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus for each and all of us is enough. God's personal care for us and His individualized plan of love for each of us is enough. It's not about what we can do but about what God has done for us.

Motto: "Lord, direct our actions to fulfill Your will."

During this Respect Life Month, let us pray in a special way for the intercession of Our Blessed Mother that she, whose "Yes" brought human life to Our Lord Jesus, will help our culture say "Yes" to life as well.

Brother Knights. I have no report regarding any specific prolife activity that our council was specifically involved in September of this year. What I do have is related good news and information about upcoming activities we all can participate in, either as a Knights of Columbus council or on an individual basis.

First the good news. Two abortion clinics, one in Germantown and the other in Prince George County have closed. Of the two, the one in Germantown was quite infamous as only one of three abortion clinics in the United State wherein late-term abortion were regularly performed by abortionist Leroy Carhart. After more than 7 years, the prayers of the faithful pro-lifers were answered when the Maryland Coalition for Life purchased the Germantown office park where it was housed and closed the abortion clinic.

As a KofC council, we are planning a pro-life mass in the Respect Life Month of October. Respect Life Month is an initiative of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. More related information is available at http://www.USCCB.org. St. Patrick Respect Life Ministry is sponsoring two related fundraisers.

An important Culture of Life event we can all participate in individually is the 40 Days for Life campaign I mentioned in our last newsletter. PERIPHERAL VISION

WE ARE CALLED TO LOOK BEYOND OUR OWN IMMEDIATE CONCERNS AND TO REACH OUT TO THOSE MOST IN NEED

PERIPHERAL VISION – what we see "out the corner of our eye" is important. If you're driving along a busy highway, peripheral vision enables you to glimpse that car just emerging from your blind spot. In a crowded room, peripheral vision helps you see people around you. It can also help you to notice a person who is off to the side, overlooked or in need of attention.

People sometimes suffer a loss of peripheral vision with age and declining eyesight, while even those with 20/20 vision can miss what should be visible to them. At a restaurant, for instance, otherwise attentive waiters sometimes seem to suddenly lose their peripheral vision if you're anxious to pay the check.

Something similar can also happen in the depth of one's heart. The peripheral vision of our hearts diminishes if we do not make it a habit to see beyond our own wants and needs. If our hearts ignore inconvenient truths and realities on the right and on the left, our field of spiritual vision will narrow.

THE EYES OF OUR HEARTS

We may think that our spiritual vision is 20/20 because we see clearly what is right in front of us. A hobby might claim most of our attention, or we may be rightfully concerned about things such as the well-being of our families, our performance at work, or long-term financial goals. It's even possible to be so wrapped up in our own spiritual lives that we cannot see the spiritual and material needs of those around us.

In the Gospels, Jesus teaches us, "The lamp of the body is the eye. If the eye is sound, your whole body will be filled with light; but if your eye is bad, your whole body will be in darkness. And if the light in you is darkness, how great will the darkness be" (Mt 6:22-23; see also Lk 11:34- 36). Just as our physical eyes perceive natural light, so too the eyes of our hearts are meant to perceive the light of God's love and truth and the dignity of our neighbor.


Pope Francis has repeatedly called us to "go the peripheries." He once said in an interview, "We need to come out of ourselves and head for the periphery. We need to avoid the spiritual sickness of a Church that is wrapped up in its own world."

The Holy Father tells us that a selfreferential Church will grow old and dim. He challenges us not to focus so intently on our own concerns that we fail to see the needs of others. He urges us to develop, with the help of God's grace, "a heart which sees" to use a phrase from Pope Benedict XVI's encyclical Deus Caritas Est. Our hearts must see those who are on the margins of the Church and society. In fact, "a closed heart," Pope Francis has observed, "cannot understand what Christianity is."


