

I was honored to attend the KofC Supreme Convention in Toronto, Canada from August 1-4 as a delegate from the Maryland State Council. It was a wonderful event and a great opportunity to meet people from all over the world and hear inspiring words from our Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, and many clergy. A letter from Pietro Cardinal Parolin, Secretary of State, conveyed Pope Francis' Apostolic Blessing 'as a pledge of strength and peace in the Lord' and his 'warm good wishes to all present, together with the assurance of his closeness in prayer.' He said that, 'The theme of this year's meeting, A Light to the Nations, stresses the missionary spirit which has characterized your Order from its earliest days as a fraternal association committed to strengthening the faith of its members and assisting those in need through corporal and spiritual works of mercy.'

In his annual report on the State of the Order, Supreme Knight Anderson said, "All of us are called to a vocation-and as Knights of Columbus, as men dedicated to charity, unity and fraternity, that vocation is to love God through service to our

neighbor. There are many organizations of Catholic men, but no other strengthens the faith of its members while also doing so much good for its neighbors." The theme of the 134th Supreme Convention is based on Isaiah 49 which says 'I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

He, and other speakers, emphasized the ongoing persecution of Christians in 108 countries around the world and especially the ongoing genocide in the Middle East. He reiterated the Order's pledge to 'expose the crimes against humanity that are being committed' and said 'It is time for a season of truth about what is happening to Christians and other minorities.' The Order's efforts convinced the American government to finally acknowledge the 'martyrdom of these Christians by its proper legal name: genocide.' He also said that, even though 'we are coming to the end of the Holy Year of Mercy, for us, as Knights of Columbus, this year should only be the end of a beginning-the beginning of greater mercy in our families, our councils, our communities, and our nations.'

You'll be pleased to know that the State of Maryland won an award at the Convention for meeting its Council Development goal for the Fraternal Year.



Raising Awareness About Life Insurance

Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging. A recent survey found that more than 75 percent of people polled did not have a personal financial advisor, even though 68 percent of them said their opinion of the current economic conditions was somewhat unfavorable or very unfavorable.

In other words, a majority of those surveyed were uncomfortable with the economy and the uncertainty it brings, yet they did not seek professional assistance. Maybe they spoke with their friends and family. Maybe they hoped the instability would go away on its own. Maybe they did not know to whom to turn. If you fall into this category, please remember that as a member of the Knights of Columbus, you have a full-time, professional agent you can call your own. My primary responsibility is the care and service of your family's life insurance, retirement and long-term care needs. I'll answer your questions because I want your decisions to be informed ones. I want to help.

Another LIMRA statistic said 43 percent of people did not buy life insurance because they worry about "making the wrong decision." Talk with me, your agent, and, afterwards, you'll understand that the only wrong decision was not purchasing sooner to protect your family's future.



In his remarks at the 134th Supreme Convention, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson said that "The 49th chapter of Isaiah begins with these words: 'Before birth the Lord called me, from my mother's womb he gave me my name.' These words reveal to us a profound truth: The child in the womb is a real, living person. And this is the truth that our Ultrasound Initiative reveals to thousands of mothers. It enables an expectant mother to see the reality, and often the personality, of her child in the womb. The Knights have donated over 700 ultrasound machines to support the cause of life around the world. We are changing hearts and minds; we are making a difference. Every time we save a life, we change the course of history. This is why the Knights of Columbus will always be at the forefront of the pro-life cause-protecting life from its beginning to its natural end."

He continued: "But sadly, abortion is not the only threat to innocent human life. Increasingly, the end of life is also under assault. Besides being morally wrong, assisted suicide laws have been abused in many countries. Strong majorities of Americans are deeply concerned about the consequences of laws that legalize assisted suicide. In 1882, widows and orphans were on the margins of society. Today, it is the unborn and those at the end of life who are at the periphery. That is why now, as throughout our history, the Knights of Columbus embraces those who are being ignored by society."

Below is a portion of the homily given by His Eminence, Cardinal Donald Wuerl Archbishop of Washington on August 3, 2016 at the opening of the 134th Supreme Convention in Toronto, Canada.

"Your Eminences, your Beatitudes, brother bishops, brother priests and deacons Worthy Supreme Knight and brother Knights of Columbus and your families, brothers and sisters in Christ.

As I begin this reflection on our celebration today, I want to express my gratitude to all of our brother Knights for this opportunity to offer this homily in the context of this Supreme Convention. In the Gospel that we have just listened to, we hear the woman's cry, 'Lord, help me.' This is a cry that echoes regularly in our hearts and on our lips, in moments of prayer, in times of challenge and in the midst of all the things that make our daily life –'Lord, help me.'

This petition is echoed in all of us as we try to make our way through life ever closer to the Lord and ever more faithful to his Gospel: 'Lord, help me.' As we ask for the Lord's constant grace, support and help, what is it he asks of us in return? The Gospel today tells us that what Jesus wants from us is our act of faith in him. He wants to be able to say to us as he said to the woman in the Gospel, 'Great is your faith and Let it be done for you as you wish."

A WORLD IN NEED OF GOD

Reflections by Lawrence P. Grayson

The world is awash in blood, and no nation is excluded. Since the beginning of this year, radical Islamic terrorists have conducted 1,300 attacks in 50 countries, killing or injuring over 25,000 people. Mass killings in the guise of warped religiosity are as likely to occur in Istanbul, Baghdad, Damascus or Jakarta, as they are in Paris, Brussels, New York.

In the beginning years of this century alone, uncountable millions of people have been shot, starved, bombed, beheaded, dismembered, or otherwise killed. Military units are fighting in Afghanistan and Iraq, Ukraine and South Sudan, Yemen and Burundi, as well as many other nations. Christians in the Middle East are being driven from their ancestral homelands almost to the point of extinction. Women and children in Nigeria have been systematically kidnapped and raped, while their men were slaughtered.

Schools, hospitals and churches are not immune from attack – in many instances they are the targets. Entire populations are fleeing to become undesired refugees in other countries, while untold numbers die in the flight. Individual and small groups of terrorists are willing to become "martyrs" in order to kill innocent bystanders. And the killing is not limited to brutal, public acts, but includes the "genteel, socially-acceptable" destruction of human life through abortion, and increasingly through euthanasia and assisted-suicide.

Archbishop Charles Chaput crystalized the root cause of this monumental violence when, in an address in 201 0, he stated: "God has never been more absent from the Western mind than he is today. Additionally, we live in an age when...[there is] a basic confusion about what – if anything at all – it means to be 'human'."

In the world at present, there are two dominant cultural systems with radically different worldviews that are colliding: Western secularity and Islamic religiosity.

The West, which has been linked to Christianity for two millennia, has considered God to be the ultimate guarantor of political life and the one who set the norms for its conduct. But this relationship has and continues to change.

Western nations today treat religion and belief in God as private matters that have no role in the public arena where the shared will of the people is formed. The results are not non-theocratic governments in which the state and church are separate, allowing many religions to exist and exercise their missions in freedom. Rather, the governments are becoming secularistic, restricting the public expression of any recognized faith and replacing it with an antitheism of atheistic secularism. In the absence of God, and unfettered by religious values and unchanging moral principles, politics is replacing religion. The state is assuming the ownership of life - how it will be begun, how it will be lived, and how it will be ended.

Past attempts to shape human affairs without consideration of God have led to dreadful consequences for humanity. In the twentieth century, the world experienced the rise of two great atheistic philosophies: National Socialism with its dogma that the future lay with the purity of the race; and Communism which divinized the power of the collective over the individual based on a synthesis arising from the clash of opposing groups or interests. The results were the annihilation of hundreds of millions of people who were of the wrong race or who opposed the devaluation of man.

Countering Western secularism is Islamic fundamentalism which promotes a religious fervor against the godlessness of Western society. The current resurgence of Islam is due to a conviction that it can offer a solid moral foundation for the life of the people, a basis that is no longer being provided in the West. Among many Islamic adherents, however, religious directives have lost their orientation, resulting in a perverse fanaticism that is brutal, blind and unrelenting. Europe and America seem to have lost the moral conviction to defeat this fanaticism, despite their continuing political, military and economic power.

How do individual Catholic Americans react to the profound secularism in their country and its worldwide effects? Most are indifferent, as long as it does not affect them personally. Oh, they may express interest in the events of the day or indignation at the latest atrocities, but they go no further. Jaded by materialism and a drive for wealth, prestige and pleasure, they have organized their public and private lives in a totally temporal way. The result is a crisis of faith. God has become an afterthought, with one's conscience, no matter how ill-formed, becoming the standard for personal behavior.

Too many Catholics now lead their lives as if God does not exist, while others make a perfunctory commitment to religion just in case He does.

Reversing this widespread secularism will not be easy. The world is brutal and indifferent, but is not too dissimilar from the one in which Our Lord sent the Apostles to evangelize. He said to them, "[D]o not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather be afraid of him who is able to destroy both body and soul in hell." (Mt 1 0.28).

America, and indeed the world, must be reevangelized. God must be brought back into public consideration. As Knights, let us lead by example. Pray to Our Lord for He never fails His people. Listen for His voice in your life. Detach yourself from the allure of the world, and with faith say the simple proclamation, "Jesus, I trust in You!" In the closing months of this Jubilee Year of Mercy, make the Rosary, the Chaplet, Eucharistic Adoration and frequent attendance at Mass the means to enable you to personally experience the love of our merciful Savior and become His instrument to change our society.

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, celebrated every year on September 14, recalls *three* historical events: The finding of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the emperor Constantine; The dedication of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary; and The restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem by the emperor Heraclius II.

But in a deeper sense, the feast also celebrates the Holy Cross as the instrument of our salvation. This instrument of torture, designed to degrade the worst of criminals, became the life-giving tree that reversed Adam's Original Sin, when he ate from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil in the Garden of Eden.
