We are in Cycle C of the Sunday mass readings. That means that our Sunday gospels come from the writings of St. Luke. Luke is also the author of the Acts of the Apostles, the book in the bible that follows the four gospels. Luke was a physician and likely a member of the elite class. In his portrayal of Jesus, he, more than any of the other gospel writers, presents Jesus as attending to the poor, the outcasts, the vulnerable, sinners, widows and orphans, in short, to those in most need. I want to tell you about an important win for religious liberty. Here's the good news: we defended the Knights of Columbus and a good Nebraskan from some anti-Catholic bigotry.

Let me back up and tell the whole story. This is about a Nebraskan, Brian Buescher, who was recently nominated by the President to be a federal judge for the district of Nebraska. He's a devoted father and a good man who will serve our state well on the court. By the way, Brian is also Catholic and he's an active member of the Knights of Columbus.

Well, this is where our story gets weird.

At Brian's confirmation hearing before the Senate Judiciary Committee a few weeks ago, one of my colleagues on the Judiciary Committee called the Knights of Columbus an extremist organization. Huh?

It got worse.

Brian then got a letter from another Senator asking him if he would resign his membership in the Knights of Columbus if he were confirmed to the Federal bench to quote "avoid the appearance of bias."

This is nuts.

These are the guys who sell tootsie rolls after church and fry fish to raise money to give back to their communities.

So, I offered a very basic resolution. I wanted Senators to unanimously reaffirm our oath of office to a Constitution that reaffirms religious liberty and condemns religious tests for federal officials.

The Senate unanimously adopted my resolution, rebuking recent anti-Catholic lines of questioning from Judiciary Committee Democrats.

This was a big win.

Religious freedom isn't a Republican belief, this isn't a Democratic belief, this is an American belief.

And the adoption of my resolution was good news for Nebraska -- and for anyone who believes in the First Amendment and religious liberty.
