
The Regional Special Olympics Bowling Tournament

A Message from the desk of Fr. Art

We stand near the doorway of the great season of penance, prayer and fasting. The scriptures for the Ash Wednesday liturgies set the tone for our Lenten journey. These sacred texts are quite specific about the path we are called to walk for the next six week. It's a path that lead us to the center of the Paschal Mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus, and our own as well.

The wisdom of God's spoken Word to us in the person of Jesus and in the Sacred Scriptures confronts many of the secular values that impact us each day. The Word of God is a Word of life and points us in the direction of the values of those who desire the Kingdom of God rather than the fleeting kingdom of this world. Lent gives us perspective. It invites us to take the larger view of why we were created and for what. It invites us to return to the Lord with all our hearts. By building on the foundation of prayer, emptying ourselves through fasting and reaching out to others in charity, we ready ourselves for new life in Christ – in the present, and for eternity.

This is a good time to set personal goals for these weeks of lent. What time of day will you set aside for prayer (perhaps using the reflection booklets)? What additional day of the week will you come to the Eucharistic Table? Will the Stations of the Cross be a time of family prayer to teach our precious young ones the extent of God's love for them? What acts of self-denial will you choose in order to reach out in charity to the suffering? Of what will you empty yourself – with what will you fill that space? Can't do it all? Do something.

Easter, Spring Time, New Life – these are the goals that we work toward as we enter this time of retreat – for ourselves and for our world.

Sound the trumpet, call an assembly, gather the people!

Many are afraid to think about life insurance because they're afraid of their mortality. But life insurance isn't about dying, it's about helping your family to live if and when something should happen to you.



The Hail Mary, a Biblical Prayer to the Mother of God



The "Hail Mary" is one of the most beautiful prayers in the world. It combines the words of the Archangel Gabriel (who is a <u>messenger</u> from God), the words of St. Elizabeth (the mother of John the Baptist, who was filled with the Holy Spirit while still in her womb), and ends with a very powerful petition for our mother Mary to pray for us always, especially at the hour of our death, when Satan will make his most powerful attempt to deceive us one last time.

The Incarnation of Jesus Christ in Mary's womb is a very special part of the Bible. It is the dividing line between the Old and the New Testaments. The Old Testament is the time before, while the New Testament is the time after, Jesus comes into the world. Every devoutly-said Hail Mary is recalling that very special time in history when the first words of <u>salvation</u> by St. Gabriel appeared in the New Testament, which fulfilled the Old Testament prophecy of the promised Messiah.


